MMI REACH Clinic

Free Behavioral Telehealth Services for Children and Adolescents

Available for up to six free appointments, which may include assessment services. Offered in English and Spanish.

The MMI Psychology Department at UNMC is offering free behavioral telehealth treatment and assessment services. This service is available for families regardless of insurance coverage.

Therapy and assessment services are offered via Zoom (a free teleconferencing platform via smartphone, tablet, or computer) or by phone.

To schedule an appointment call 402-559-6408. State that you are interested in scheduling an appointment with the REACH Clinic at MMI.

This is a non-emergency service. If your family is experiencing an emergency please contact the Nebraska Family Helpline at 888-868-8680 or 911.



Our behavioral health clinicians can provide the following support:

- Managing difficult child behaviors (difficulty following directions, difficulty at meal times, school refusal, sleep concerns)
- Provide treatment for youth with mood concerns, anxiety, and self-harm behaviors
- Provide diagnostic assessment services
- Help with developing positive family communication and relationships
- Connect families with local resources
- Help families cope with COVID-19 (scan code below)

VOLUNTEERISM

Volunteerism: The use or involvement of volunteer labor, especially in community services. The practice of providing time and skills for the benefit of other people and causes rather than for financial benefit. Covid has restricted the ways our church has been able to gather in large groups to assist the Jubilee center, Campus Lutheran and others.

Because of this in October we brought together some members of First Lutheran Church to discuss their volunteer activities. We are happy to see that Volunteerism is alive and well at FLC. We have members providing home meals to neighbors and shut ins, meals at church for the needy, building low-income homes, providing cards to shut ins, teaching English to immigrants, providing clothing to those in need, supporting the children's museum, assisting the Salvation Army, helping children cope with broken families, guiding and helping middle and high school students strengthen their skills, protecting wildlife and more.

Since we cannot gather in large groups this fall/winter we wanted to provide you with ideas on how to help your fellow members of the community. We have provided a list of 30 ideas for you to help those in need. If you desire, you may provide them a Random Act of Kindness card to let them know that the source of the assistance. We encourage everyone to reach out wherever and whenever they can. During this time of Coronavirus we need to reach out and make sure our neighbors are being cared for.

JUBILEE MEALS

In January – March for the past few years First Lutheran Church has been hosting the Jubilee meals for anyone that needs a meal. In January we have also been providing the meals and servers. Due to Coronavirus the Jubilee Center has discontinued the Thursday night meals until further notice.

In lieu of providing the meals in 2021 we are promoting that our members collect food for the Jubilee food pantry by bringing non-perishable goods that we will provide to the center.

Food items may be dropped off at the church from now until the start of Lent. We will provide a drop box or cart in the Narthex to drop off your items.

WORSHIP THEMES

JANUARY 3

SECOND SUNDAY OF CHRISTMAS
JEREMIAH 31:7-14; PSALM 147:12-20;
EPHESIANS 1:3-14; JOHN 1[1-9]10-18
Within the gospel reading's profound words lies
the simple message that God is revealed in a
human person. Though we may try to
understand how the Word existed with God
from the beginning of time, the wonder we
celebrate at Christmas is that the Word
continues to dwell among us. Christ comes
among us in the gathered assembly, the
scriptures, the waters of new birth, and the
brad and the wine. Through these ordinary
gifts we receive the fullness of God's grace and
truth.

JANUARY 10

BAPTISM OF OUR LORD GENESIS 1:1-5, PSALM 29, ACTS 19:1-7, MARK 1:4-11

Our re-creation in baptism is an image of the Genesis creation, where the Spirit of God moved over the waters. Both Mark's gospel and the story in Acts make it clear that it is the Spirit's movement that distinguishes Jesus' baptism from John's. The Spirit has come upon us as Jesus and the Ephesians, calling us God's beloved children and setting us on Jesus' mission to re-create the world in the image of God's vision of justice and peace.

JANUARY 17

SECOND SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY 1 SAMUEL 3:1-10[11-20]; PSALM 130:1-6, 13-18, 1 CORINTHIANS 6:12-20; JOHN 1:43-51 All the baptized have a calling in God's world. God calls not just pastors and deacons; but also the youngest child, like Samuel. The story of the calling of Nathanael plays with the idea of place. Nathanael initially dismisses Jesus because he comes from Nazareth. But where we come from isn't important; its where-or rather whom- we come to. Jesus refers to Jacob, who had a vision in a place he called "the house of God, and ...the gate of heaven" (Gen 28:17). Jesus says he himself is the place where Nathanael will meet God.

JANUARY 24

THIRD SUNDAY AFTER EPHIPHANY JONAH 3:1-5,10; PSLAM 62:5-12; 1 CORINTHIANS 7:29-31; MARTH 1:14-20 As we continue through the time after Epiphany, stories of the call to discipleship show up the implications of our baptismal calling to show Christ to the world. Jesus begins proclaiming the good news and calling people to repentance right after John the Baptist is arrested for preaching in a similar way. Knowing that John was later executed, we see at the very outset the cost of discipleship. Still, the two sets of brothers leave everything they have known and worked for all their lives to follow Jesus and fish for people.

JANUARY 31

FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER EPHIPANY DEUTERONOMY 18:15-20; PSALM 111; 1 CORINTHIANS 8:1-13; MARK 1:21-28 In Deuteronomy, God promises to raise up a prophet like Moses, who will speak for God; in Psalm 111, God shows the people the power of God's works. For the church these are ways of pointing to the unique authority people sensed in Jesus' actions and words. We counter that authority in God's word, around which we gather, the word that prevails over any lesser spirit that would claim power over us, freeing us to follow Jesus.

God's answer is always yes...

The first time my pastor said this to me, I was in my first year of full-time youth ministry. I had all the questions, all the doubt about my ability to carry out the ministry, and then, even more questions... of myself, of how on earth this ministry thing is supposed to work, of God.

And frankly, those feelings are not all that unfamiliar, beginning my first call in pastoral ministry in the middle of a pandemic!

But she kept saying it to me when I would go to her with questions and confusion, and it started to sink in. The Holy Spirit has a way of doing that kind of thing.

And scripture seemed to really back up her words:

"Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened for you..." (Matthew 7:7).

"If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you" (John 15:7).

"For in God every one of God's promises is a 'Yes.' For this reason, it is through God that we say the 'Amen', to the glory of God." (2 Corinthians 1:20).

And those are just a few New Testament examples. There is the Israelites escape out of Egypt, Job's suffering, and so many more examples of God showing up with God's "yes" for God's people.

God's answer is always yes.

And God's "yes" doesn't often look like how we imagine, determine, or turn out to be just what we asked for.

Even still,

God's answer is always yes.

What if, in the middle of our pandemic fatigue, in our own confusion, in the midst of all our questions and complaints and frustrations we face in our own lives, in our community, in our world – we trusted that God's answer is always "yes" – even though we can't control how God chooses to roll out God's "yes?"

What does God's "yes" to you look like as we enter 2021?
