Jesus, the NFL Draft, Confirmation

What do these three have in common? At first glance, probably nothing; although this year the NFL Draft and our Confirmation service (or Affirmation of Baptism service) at First Lutheran occur in four consecutive days (Thursday April 29 through Sunday May 2). Since the end of the Super Bowl on February 7, sports blogs, podcasts, call-in radio shows, TV programs, online sport news, etc. have focused on the NFL Draft. Over the years, the NFL draft has gone from a relatively obscure occurrence conducted over the phone to a mega million-dollar extravaganza watched by over 47 million people on TV over three days (with millions more checking-in online) and with an in-person attendance of over half a million people. This year 259 of the very best eligible college football players will be chosen by one of the 32 NFL teams with the Jacksonville Jaguars (last year's worst team) having the first selection and the Tampa Bay Buccaneers (the reigning Super Bowl champions) choosing with the very last pick. Any given football player's abilities, experience, talent, and potential mean everything and have already by evaluated and ranked by each and every NFL team. Almost every single facet of the NFL draft (from pro-workout days to mock drafts to trades to Bill Belichick's dog) has been or will be covered by some outlet of the media. After a Presidential election, the NFL draft is the ultimate choosing event in our country.

So how does Jesus connect to the spectacle which has become the annual NFL draft? Jesus has told his disciples (both first century and twenty-first century disciples!): "You did not choose me, but I chose you." (John 15:16) Just as a college player doesn't get to choose which team drafts them with what draft pick, we do not choose Jesus. Jesus chooses us. Jesus chooses us by the power of the Holy Spirit through God's Word and the Sacraments. What is very different between Jesus' choosing and the choosing in the NFL draft, however, is ability. NFL teams' draft choices are ultimately determined by ability. If a football player does not have a certain pre-judged level of ability, they won't be chosen on draft day. But not so with Jesus. Jesus did not choose us because of the fantastic abilities we possess or showcase. In fact, in many ways Jesus has chosen us despite our very human, frail abilities. There were no tryouts, workouts, or game film which helped determine our being chosen by Jesus. Simply put, Jesus chooses us because Jesus is in God's salvation business.

How does this relate to Confirmation? By and large, a person does choose to be Confirmed; to make public affirmation of their baptism. On the one hand, in our Lutheran tradition Confirmation is not a Sacrament. A person's salvation is not determined by their choosing to be confirmed or not to be confirmed. On the other hand, Confirmation is indeed a significant event. It is a person's acknowledgment of the Sacrament of Baptism through which Jesus had chosen them. A person's public Confirmation vows help set a course for their discipleship as an adult member of the Church of Jesus Christ. Where that course of discipleship will take them beyond their day of Confirmation, we do not know. But we trust. We trust that Confirmation is not a graduation from discipleship; but a transition into new stages and ventures of discipleship. WORSHIP THEMES AND INFORMATION

MAY 2, 2021 FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER ACTS 8:26-40; PSALM 22:25-31; 1 JOHN 4:7-21; JOHN 15:1-8

This Sunday's image of how the risen Christ shares his life with us is the image of the vine. Christ the vine and we the branches are alive in each other, in the mystery of the abiding described in the gospel and the first letter of John. Baptism makes us a part of Christ's living and life-giving self and makes us alive with Christ's life. As the vine brings food to the branches, Christ feeds us at his table. We are sent out to bear fruit for the life of the world.

MAY 9, 2021

SIXTH SUNDAY OF EASTER ACTS 10:44-48; PSALM 98; 1 JOHN 5:1-6; JOHN 15:9-17

This Sunday's image of the life the risen Christ shares with us is the image of friendship. We are called to serve others as Jesus came to serve; but for John's gospel, the image of servanthood is too hierarchical, too distant, to capture the essence of life with Christ. Friendship captures the love, the joy, the deep mutuality of the relationship into which Christ invites us. The Greeks believed that true friends are willing to die for each other. This is the mutual love of Christian community commanded by Christ and enabled by the Spirit.

MAY 16, 2021 SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER PSALM 1; 1 JOHN 5:9-13; JOHN 17:6-19

The gospel for Easter's seventh Sunday is always taken from the long prayer Jesus prays for his followers in John's gospel on the night before his death, and always includes Jesus' desire that his followers will be one as he and the Father are one. The oneness is not mere doctrinal agreement or institutional unity, but mutual abiding, interpenetrating life, mutual love, and joy. The oneness is the work of the Spirit whom we have received; but also await. Come Holy Spirit!

MAY 23, 2021

DAY OF PENTECOST

ACTS 2:1-21; PSALM 104:24-34, 35b; ROMANS 8:22-27; JOHN 15-26-27; 16:4b-15

Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Crossing all boundaries that would separate us, the Spirit brings the wideness of God's mercy to places we least expect it – to a crowd of strangers of different lands and tongues, to dry bones, to our weak hearts. Jesus promises his disciples that they will be accompanied by the Holy Spirit, and that this Spirit reveals the truth. We celebrate that we too have been visited with this same Spirit. Guided by the truth, we join together in worship, and then disperse to share the fullness of Christ's love with the world.

MAY 30, 2021

THE HOLY TRINITY; FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

ISAIAH 6:1-8; PSALM 29; ROMANS 8:12-17; JOHN 3:1-17

When we say God is the triune God, we are saying something about who God is beyond, before, and after the universe: that there is community within God. Our experience of this is reflected in Paul's words today. When we pray to God as Jesus prayed to his Abba (an everyday, intimate parental address), the Spirit prays within us, creating between us and God the same relationship Jesus has with the one who sent him.


