Clear, Calm, and Connected

We begin every Council meeting with devotions. Each member of the Council takes a turn leading a chapter from the current book we are using. Beginning in August, we will be starting *Clear*, *Calm*, *and Connected*: *Reflections on Church Leadership*. This book incorporates family systems theory with insights and tools from real congregational experiences and, of course, Scripture.

So what does it mean to be a leader who is clear, calm, and connected?

Clear. It begins with defining who we are. What is our role in this particular situation? What are our core values and beliefs? What are we called to do in this particular situation? When we are clear about our roles and responsibilities, then we can be healthy leaders.

Calm. This is about maintaining a less-anxious presence. You may have heard of the phrase "non-anxious presence." In these days, pretty much every situation and conversation have some level of anxiety. The question becomes do we allow the anxiety to overtake us and our decision-making processes, or do we adopt a less-anxious more calm approach? When we are less anxious and calmer, then we can be healthy leaders.

Connected. Quite often when conflict arises or people are experiencing anxiety, the first reaction is to cut off. While that might seem like a normal reaction, it is indeed that – a reaction. When we respond rather than react, we are able to stay connected to those around us while still expressing our thoughts and feelings about a particular situation or issue. When we are responsive rather than reactive, then we can be healthy leaders.

When we focus on our strengths, it is much easier to be clear, calm, and connected. As we lean into this Fall, we will be having conversations about the future of our facility (see Extreme Church Makeover on p. 17). We will continue to grieve the losses we experienced during the ongoing pandemic, remembering all those who have died on All Saints Sunday. We will be reconnecting in our worship, education, and social opportunities (see Pastor Elisabeth's installation invitation on p. 3). In all of this, it is important to extend grace to ourselves and one another. When we focus on who is here and what is happening, then we can be clear in our leadership, calm about our outward circumstances, and connected to one another as the Body of Christ. Thanks be to God!

COUNCIL UPDATE

Greetings from the Council,

We have all seen the images on television. The massive wildfires and forest fires often occurring in the American West. These fires can spread rapidly. Without very little warning, they can turn land, property, ecosystems and lives upside down. The aftermath will have those affected by the fires asking, "Now what do I do?"

The last 16 months have turned a lot of businesses, schools, churches and other organizations upside down as well. Much like the aftermath of a wildfire, many people today are asking, "Now what do we do?"

As devastating as wildfires may be to a local ecosystem, there can often be a good ending to the story. Nature has a way of healing itself under proper conditions. The natural pattern of recovery after a wildfire is referred to as ecological succession. This is the process whereby the land, plants and wildlife move through various ecological stages in order to return to a state of relative stability. Eventually the ecosystem can return to its original state or something very similar. This is possible because every factor in an ecosystem depends on every other factor.

In a way, churches have their own ecosystems. This most certainly includes First Lutheran. We are one big interconnected system. Every member of First Lutheran depends on every other member to make it all work. Much like thousands of churches across this country, First Lutheran is in the process of returning to a state of relative stability. So how do we do this? We do this first and foremost, by using our Lord as our guide. Isaiah 40:31 states "But those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint." We will also continue to do this by praying together, working together, giving together, volunteering together, caring together, aspiring together and loving together. When all of these components are in place, the ecosystem of First Lutheran will be renewed and full of life. Your council looks forward to going through this renewal with all of you.

August 1, 2021

TENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

EXODUS 16:2-4, 9-15; PSALM 78:23-29; EPHESIANS 4:1-16; JOHN 6:24-35

Apparently not satisfied by Jesus' feeding of thousands, some who were there press him for a sign of his power; perhaps it is daily manna they want. As always in John's gospel when people want a sign, Jesus offers himself. He is the bread come from heaven to give life to the world. He calls us to come to him and believe in him, and through that relationship to know the one who sent him.

August 8, 2021

ELEVENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

1 KINGS 19:4-8; PSALM 34:1-8; EPHESIANS 4:25-5-2; JOHN 6:35, 41-51

Jesus says that the bread he gives for the life of the world is his flesh, and whoever eats this bread has enteral life now and will be raised on the last day. In Ephesians, Paul tells us what this life Jesus gives us looks like, this life we live as those marked with the seal of the Holy Spirit in baptism. We live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us. The whole purpose of life is giving yourself for the other.

August 15, 2021

TWELVETH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

PROVERBS 9:106; PSALM 34:9-14; EPHESIANS 5:15-20; JOHN 6:51-58

Wisdom prepares a feast, sets her table, and invites all to come and eat her bread and drink her wine. The first chapter of John's gospel owes much to the biblical tradition that imaged wisdom as existing before anything was created and having a role in the work of creation. Christ, the wisdom of God (1 Cor. 1:24), today invites us to eat his flesh and drink his blood. John's gospel includes no account of the institution of the Lord's supper, but here we can't help hearing Jesus' words as an invitation to the meal of bread and wine we share.

August 22, 2021

THIRTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

JOSHUA 24:1-2a, 14-18; PSALM 34:15-22; EPHESIANS 6:10-20; JOHN 6:56-69

In today's gospel many people take offense at Jesus' invitation to eat his flesh and drink his blood; even many of Jesus' disciples peel off. This is the backdrop in John's gospel for Peter's confession of faith. "To whom can we go?" asks Peter, in words we sometimes sing just before the gospel is read. "You have the words of eternal life." In order to take such a stand, as Peter and Joshua did, Paul tells us to arm ourselves with the word of God. We pray in the Spirit that we might be bold ambassadors of the gospel.

August 29, 2021

FOURTEENTH SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST

DEUTERONOMY 4:1-2, 6-9, PSALM 15, JAMES 1:17-27; MARK 7:1-8, 14-15, 21-23

Jesus protects against human customs being given the weight of divine law, while the essence of God's law is ignored. True uncleanness comes not from external things, but from the intentions of the human heart. Last week Jesus told us "the words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life" (John 6:63). Now James says God has given us birth by the word of truth. We who were washed in the word when we were born in the font return to it every Sunday to ask God to create in us clean hearts.


