¹For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: ²a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; ³a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; ⁴a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; ⁵a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; ⁶a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to throw away; ⁷a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; ⁸a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace. (Ecclesiastes 3: 1-8)

It has been a tough few weeks. After having some time away in Virginia to visit family and to lead a retreat for couples who are both pastors, we returned to a number of deaths and funerals. Some planned. Some unexpected. There are other types of things we grieve other than physical death, such as the loss of a relationship with a partner, friend or child, job changes, changes to our health, how things "used to be" and the list goes on.

As the reading from Ecclesiastes reminds us, there is a time for everything. We need to take time to laugh and dance, as well as weep and morn. One of the hardest parts of walking with someone who is grieving is "the time to keep silence, and the time to speak" part of the text. We might feel the need to speak to fill the silence. We might think it is not enough to simply be with someone while they cry or share their frustrations. The temptation is there to want to fix things.

Let me offer a few ways to console someone who is grieving that are more on the helpful (less on the hurtful) side of things:

- 1. "I am so sorry for your loss." (No further explanation needed.)
- 2. "How are you <u>today</u>?"
- 3. "When can I ... pick up food for dinner, do your laundry, go to the grocery store, walk the dog, mow the lawn, etc."
- 4. Leave them care packages.
- 5. Instead of bringing a meal, bring over paper products, snacks, coffee.
- 6. Remember the big dates: anniversaries, birthdays, holidays, the date of death. Send a note or text.

There is no right or one way to grieve or to help someone who has experienced a loss. We all deal with losses of different magnitudes in a myriad of ways. Accompaniment is at the heart of this. It is whatever way you are able to accompany the person, and how they desire your help and presence.

We don't do this alone. We go with God's presence and the Holy Spirit leading us and guiding us.

WORSHIP THEMES AND INFORMATION

September 5, 2021 TIME AFTER PENTECOST

ISAIAH 35:4-7A; PSALM 146; JAMES 2:1-10 [11-13] 14-17; MARK 7:24-37; PSALM 125

James tells us to stop showing favoritism in the assembly, treating the rich visitor with more honor than the poor one. Jesus himself seems to show partiality in his first response to the Syrophoenician women in today's gospel. Was he testing her faith in saying Gentiles don't deserve the goods meant for God's children? Or was he speaking out of his human worldview, but transcended those limits when she took him by surprise with her reply? Either way, the story tells us that God shows no partiality. Everyone who brings a need to Jesus is received with equal honor as a child and heir.

September 12, 2021 TIME AFTER PENTECOST

ISAIAH 50:4-9A; PSALM 116:1-9; JAMES 3:1-12; MARK 8:27-38

Three weeks ago, we heard Peter's confession of faith as told in John's gospel. This week we hear Mark's version, when Peter says, "You are the Messiah." In John, the stumbling block is Jesus' invitation to eat his flesh, given for the life of the world. In Mark too the scandal has to do with Jesus' words about his own coming of death, and here Peter himself stumbles over Jesus' words. But Jesus is anointed (the meaning of *messiah*) in Mark only on the way to the cross (14:3); so we are anointed in baptism with the sign of the cross.

September 19, 2021 TIME AFTER PENTECOST

JEREMIAH 11:18-20; PSALM 54; JAMES 3:13-4:3, 7-8A, MARK 9:30-37

Today we hear James warn against selfish ambition, while the disciples quarrel over which one of them is the greatest. Jesus tells them the way to be great is to serve. Then, to make it concrete, he puts in front of them a flesh-and-blood child. We are called to welcome the children God puts in front of us, to make room for them in daily interaction, and to give them a place of honor in the assembly.

September 26, 2021 TIME AFTER PENTECOST

NUMBERS 11:4-6, 10-16, 24-29, PSALM 19:7-14; JAMES 5:13-20; MARK 9:38-50

Someone who isn't part of Jesus' own circle is casting out demons in Jesus' name, and the disciples want him stopped. They appeal to Jesus, as Joshua did to Moses about the elders who prophesied without official authorization. Like Moses, Jesus refuses to see this as a threat. Jesus welcomes good being done in his name, even when it is not under his control. The circle we form around Jesus' word must be able to value good being done in ways we wouldn't do it, by people we can't keep tabs on.

Laying on of Hands for Healing

Beginning in September, we will have Laying on of Hands for Healing in the Narthex during Communion. The Laying on of Hands for Healing will occur on the first and third weekends. In September it will occur on September 4/5 and September 18/19. After a person has received Communion, they are invited to come to the Narthex where one of our pastors will anoint them with oil and prayer for them.
