



COUNCIL UPDATE

Greetings from Council,

I'm writing this approximately two weeks before Thanksgiving. In the United States, we celebrate the Thanksgiving holiday on the fourth Thursday of November. Last January I started a gratitude journal. This was not my idea. It was actually the idea of one of my fellow coaches at the high school. My life is far from perfect and I have experienced plenty of tough times in my life. However, when I can sit down each morning and list three new things that I'm thankful for, that can be pretty powerful. The second thing that really opened my eyes is how many times my daily gratitude has involved First Lutheran. I went back and looked and 82 of my days involved First Lutheran in some way. These included people, sermons, songs, meetings, celebrations and much more. According to my gratitude journal, I'm just a little bit thankful for a lot of things at the church that sits at 3315 Avenue G. When you do a daily gratitude journal, you realize just how much you have to be thankful for. First Lutheran is certainly toward the top of my list.

Sticking with the Thanksgiving theme, the church council decided at our November meeting that the collection from the special Thanksgiving offering will be designated for the Special Needs Fund. FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT


LUKE 1:46b-55; PSALM 80:1-7; HEBREWS 10:5-10; LUKE 1:39-45 [46-55]

Cradle and cross are inextricably connected to the fourth Sunday of Advent. Between a lovely tribute to the little town of Bethlehem and Mary's magnificent song of praise, the letter to the Hebrews reminds us in no uncertain terms that Christ's advent is for "the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for all." It is the kind of tension in which the church always lives as when in holy communion – with the high delight – "we proclaim the Lord's death".

1 Samuel 2:18-20, 26, Psalm 148, Colossians 3:12-17; Luke 2:41-52,

On the first Sunday of Christmas we find the boy Samuel and the boy Jesus, both in the temple, both growing in wisdom and stature and in favor with God and humankind. We too have returned to the house of God "to sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God," who has gifted us with a savior. As the festival continues, "let the peace of Christ rule in your heart." 
Congratulations to our December Volunteers of the Month: The Stewardship Team!

A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR ELISABETH

My 96-year old grandmother, Joyce Pynn, died last month. I had the honor of visiting her in October, near Walnut Creek, CA where I was born and raised. I hadn't been to Northern California (NorCal) in four years, and my heart flooded with memories of growing up there. As I held the grief of, I wrote this reflection. I share it here as a meditation on the Advent season we have entered: a time of hopeful longing, a time of lengthening shadows, a time of great anticipation of Jesus' birth - in whom we have our only hope.

Here in the golden hills of NorCal
It's like every fall I remember
70 degrees, clear blue skies, everyone praying for rain.
Driving by the schools, neighborhoods,
and soccer fields of my youth I remember well this place that
formed me:

The winding roads of the Diablo foothills, where I perfected the manual transmission; Castle Rock Park where I may have spent some time ditching senior English class. The perfect TOGOS salami and provolone, eaten in the Encina Grande parking lot where my girlfriends and I hoped to catch a glimpse of our latest crush on a Friday night. The traffic on Ygnacio Valley Road, the hours spent at Broadway Plaza, the sawdust floor at Skipolinis Pizza where I had my first date.

Here in the golden hills of NorCal

I hold the hand of my dying grandmother,

wishing for one more trip with her to JCPenney for a new fall outfit.

I wonder if she remembers that I chipped the foot of her porcelain (life size!) cat when I was 8?

There are romance novels at her bedside, next to her Bible, bookmarked in 1 Samuel.

Hannah's Song. Did she leave off there? Did Hannah's story have special meaning to her? So many questions.

So, I open another cup of tapioca pudding, add thickener to her water and find a bendy straw.

I offer it and she sips, perhaps both of us

wishing it was a Fenton's Banana Split we could share.

She asks, "where's everybody else?"

And I tell her again.

There is life

And death

In these golden hills of NorCal.
