Birthday Musings Part 2

In case you have not realized it yet, Pastor Rick and I celebrate our birthdays in the beginning of the calendar year – January and February. Last month, Pastor Rick reminisced about the different places he has celebrated his January natal day. Since it is a milestone birthday for me this February, I have been in a more contemplative mood. As I have been remembering the avocado green rotary phone that hung on the wall in our kitchen when I hold my iPhone in my hand or the quietness of the engine in my hybrid vehicle, these words keep coming to mind, "It helps now and then to step back and take the long view." This is part of a homily written by Father Ken Untener in 1979 to honor the memory of Archbishop Oscar Romero after his assassination. I think the long view is especially important in these days of rapidly changing events and news cycles. Some birthdays nudge us more than others to think about what has changed over our lives both in the world around us and in ourselves. Such contemplation is a worthwhile task.

It can also be important for a congregation to take the long view as well. If we get stuck in what is or is not happening in the moment, we lose sight of the long view. As Christians, we are seed planters. Trusting in God's faithfulness as we water that which has been planted. There aren't any guarantees, simply promises and opportunities for God's grace to enter. Here is the piece in its entirety for your contemplation.

"It helps now and then to step back and take the long view. The Kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, it is even beyond our vision. We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work. Nothing we do is complete, which is another way of saying that the Kingdom always lies beyond us. No statement says all that should be said. No prayer fully expresses our faith. No confession brings perfection. No pastoral visit brings wholeness. No program accomplishes the church's mission. No set of goals and objectives includes everything. This is what we are about. We plant the seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise. We lay foundations that will need further development. We provide yeast that produces effects far beyond our capabilities. We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something, and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest. We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker. We are workers, not master builders, ministers, not messiahs. We are prophets of a future that is not our own."

Adult Forum: February 6th @ 9:50am

On February 6, Derek Schweitzer will be conducting an adult forum in between services. The topic will cover the struggles of individuals and families as we all negotiate life after the holidays in our desire for spring's arrival. All of this while fighting the fatigue of the pandemic. Mr. Schweitzer is a Licensed Independent Mental Health Practitioner and a Licensed Clinical Social Worker who is a member of our congregation. He will be presenting on the Cognitive Behavioral Therapy model and how this applies to mental health. Mr. Schweitzer will be highlighting areas such as the pitfalls of cognitive distortions and the utilization of faith, hope, boundaries, coping skills, and scripture. The forum will be presented with the use of a Christ-centered lens in combating everyday life.

Now I lay me down to Sleep I pray the Lord my soul to Keep Angels watch me through the Night And wake me with the morning Light Amen

Now I Lay Me Down to Sleep,

Many of us are familiar with this prayer that we learned as children from our parents, as we snuggled into bed at night. But sometimes, for a variety of reasons, children and adults do not have that bed to snuggle into.

People often ask what item is most commonly requested through Care Portal, a technology platform designed to connected children and families in crisis to churches and people who want to help. Across the 20 U.S. states that Care Portal is active in, and within Buffalo County, the answer is clear: beds and cribs.

Reasons for needing a bed vary, but some include: poverty, escape from circumstances without the ability to bring belongings, insect infestation, or unexpected addition of a family member. Sometimes, providing a bed for each family member is a requirement for children to be reunified with parents, or for a family member to care for a child, so they are not placed with others.

So, the Mission Outreach Team of First Lutheran Church has designated this as the Lenten Project for this year. There are different ways that you can help:

- Donate to the collection boxes located at the Welcome Stations in the narthex.
- Volunteer to build basic beds that are ready to meet those requests.
- Volunteer to deliver a bed to a family in need.
- **Pray** for families in need, and for the staff at agencies that serve them.

The Election of a New Bishop for the Nebraska Synod

At the next Nebraska Synod Assembly (June 2-4, 2022 in Kearney), there will be an election for a new Bishop to serve a six-year term. First Lutheran will have eight delegates at this Assembly (our three pastors and five lay delegates to be elected by the Congregation Council). Dear Adults of First Lutheran,

Did you know you are all a vital part of our high school youth ministry team? Thanks for agreeing to the challenge! Are you excited? Fear not: you do not need sleep on floors or chaperone a lock-in!

All you need to do is say, "Yay!"

"Yay!" by knowing young people's names. Teenagers will know they are loved by the sound of their name in your voice. "Yay!" by finding and affirming all that is good among the brilliant teenagers in our congregation. Teenagers tend to hear (even if it's not what's being said) what they are doing wrong. "Yay!" by telling young people's parents all you see that is good. Teenagers will know you see things their parents might not, and parents need to hear it more than you know! "Yay!" by telling them you lit a candle and prayed for them. Not all teenagers are lucky enough to know people who actually practice faith. "Yay!" by sharing your faith stories.
