



# COUNCIL UPDATE

Greetings from Church Council,

In 1996, the first *Mission Impossible* movie was released. Five other *Mission Impossible* movies have since become a part of the series. Each of the movies have a common theme. The main character (Tom Cruise) is given a mission to accomplish. Each mission is thought to be an impossible task. Yet, somehow, he is able to get the mission accomplished. Of course, Hollywood endings might have a little to do with this.

What does this have to do with First Lutheran? Back in January, the council had its annual leadership retreat. Our focus at the retreat was to update the church mission statement. A mission statement basically explains in one sentence why our church exists and what our overall intention is. Mission statements are important because they can give an organization meaning, purpose and direction. We had a very productive day and thought we had a great start on a new mission statement. At our March meeting, we revisited our work and put the finishing touches on it. Finally, at our April meeting the council approved the new mission statement. This is what we came up with:

"Growing in God's grace, reflecting Christ's love, and living in the Spirit."

A lot of businesses, organizations and churches have mission statements and there are a lot of mission statements that sound great. However, it can't be something that simply sounds great. In order for a mission statement to truly have meaning, we need to bring it to life by what we do. How do we do this? How can we demonstrate that our mission statement is more than just words? Well, this is just a small sample. We can grow in God's grace by worshiping, praying, studying God's word and reaching out to all of God's children. We can reflect Christ's love by serving others and caring for others. We can live in the Spirit by realizing that we are imperfect people; we are an imperfect church and we live in an imperfect world. Yet, we still have hope and we can still celebrate because of God's forgiveness of our imperfections.

We want people to know our mission statement not only by the words that they hear or read, but by the actions that they see. We are fully capable of making our mission statement more than just a bunch of words. In the movie, the mission was viewed as impossible. However, at First Lutheran our mission is possible!

# CAMPUS LUTHERAN




