On November 6th a congregational meeting will be held to vote about moving forward with a capital campaign to remodel our office area and upgrade our aging HVAC system. This is a big decision for the congregation. This project will be a challenge for our congregation and is a great opportunity for us to grow in spirit and faith. It will also position First Lutheran for new opportunities in shared ministry and joining in God's work in us and through us. As you enter into discernment on this decision we would ask you to reflect on Isaiah 41:10: "Fear not, for I am with you; be not dismayed, for I am your God; I will strengthen you, I will help you, I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

What will these upgrades do for us and the ministries of First Lutheran? How will God's kingdom be advanced through these efforts? Two key benefits are improved hospitality and better stewarding our spaces and resources.

#### **Improved Hospitality**

- We need a more welcoming and inviting reception space for guests and members. Currently, our reception area is a total of approximately 144 square feet, and the copy machine and desk take up much of that space. We have no space within our reception area to offer a guest a seat. Thank goodness Kandy is so welcoming as our reception area does not fit that description.
- It would be desirable to have a warm, comfortable, and private area for Pastors to use as they meet with people in need of counseling and consoling. Currently those meetings are conducted in our old library area.
- We need to respect and honor our old sanctuary. It is a sacred space. Currently the west end of our old sanctuary is used as a storage area.
- Relocation of the nursery area closer to the sanctuary will make parents more comfortable and more willing to use this space.
- The remodeling project will allow us to knock out a wall and increase the size of the coffee area creating a more welcoming and open environment. Our coffee area fosters community and is where much ministering takes place.

#### **Better Stewards of Spaces & Resources**

- Office area size. Did you know that we currently do not have enough offices for all staff if co-lead Pastors were not willing to share an office?
- Offices matter for recruitment and retention of key employees and Pastors. At this time there are over fifty openings for Pastors within the Nebraska Synod alone.
- The more comfortable and efficient the office space the more productive staff will be.
- Much of our HVAC system is 25 to 30 years old well past typical useful life and operating on a wing and prayer. These systems cannot be replaced in any short order. Upgrades to the system will also provide much greater efficiency.

In closing, we would ask you to reflect on Jeremiah 29:11: "For I know the plans I have for you," declares the LORD, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future." What is God's plan for First Lutheran Church by 2030? Will we have the courage to join God's invitation?

### Council Report - Endowment and Personnel News

Greetings First Lutheran Congregation,

Here's a brief report of the latest happenings with your Congregational Council. We approved two endowment requests. Let me take this opportunity to remind people about our strong Endowment here at First Lutheran. We have been blessed with many financial gifts towards our endowment. That creates opportunities to give back to our church, our community, and beyond. Anyone can make an Endowment request for a special project or beneficiary. All requests are reviewed by the Endowment Committee. Forms are available in the church office.

Additionally, we reviewed a recommendation from the Personnel Team to increase the pay for our organists/accompanists. Our pay rates had not been changed for a very long time and we learned that we were paying below the industry average. By making our pay more competitive, we hope to keep our amazing and talented musicians as long as they are willing and able to share their talents. Our people are our greatest resources. We feel it is important to take care of all our staff – full-time and part-time - as best as we can.

In other Personnel news, we accepted Adam Eilers' resignation as our full-time Maintenance Coordinator. Adam has accepted another job and we wish him the best of luck in his future endeavors. He did outstanding work during his time here. Please be sure to thank him the next time you see him!

Working in conjunction with Personnel and Property & Management Teams, the council has established a short-term succession plan to handle the maintenance and facility needs of the church, and we have already begun searching for Adam's replacement.

Finally, the council reviewed the upcoming events calendar. There are so many things to look forward to in the coming months. The holidays are right around the corner and that brings extra opportunities to sing praises to our Lord. November 20, 2022 CHRIST THE KING


JEREMIAH 23:1-6; PSALM 46; COLOSSIANS 1:11-20; LUKE 23:33-43

Jeremiah's promise of the execution of "justice and righteousness in the land" finds ironic fulfillment in the execution of Jesus of Nazareth, the King of the Jews. It appears utterly contradictory that a king should be crucified with a criminal. This victory appears for all the world as humiliating defeat. Yet through the gate of death Jesus opens the door to paradise.

### November 27, 2022 FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

ISAIAH 2:1-5; PSALM 122; ROMANS 13:11-14; MATTHEW 24:36-44

The new church year begins with a wake-up call: Christ is coming soon! In today's readings both Paul and Jesus challenge us to wake up from sleep, for we know neither the day nor the hour of the Lord's coming. Isaiah proclaims the day when God will gather all people on the holy mountain and there will be no more war or suffering. Though we vigilantly watch for the promised day of salvation, we wait for what we already have: Christ comes along us this day as the word and meal that strengthens our faith in the promises of God.

### A WORD FROM PASTOR ELISABETH

Dear First Lutheran,

In September, I had the honor of baptizing Reed Wagner, one of FLC's organists and an active young adult at Campus Lutheran. After long conversations, discernment, and prayer, Reed asked to be baptized because he realized just how expansive God's love is, and that it's big enough for him. While we Lutheran's aren't typically the full-immersion baptism type, Reed grew up in a different faith tradition that does full-immersion, so we went for it.

Since Reed came as a leader on the FLY mission trip to Kansas City last summer, he's also gotten involved with youth group on Wednesday nights. Gathered together with FLY and the young adults of Campus Lutheran, we laid hands on him and prayed, lit candles as a sign of Christ's light that cannot be overcome by any darkness (even though Nebraska wind tried to have its way), and welcomed him to the body of Christ with angel food cake and lots of gifts. It was a beautiful, holy night to be the church.

Here's what was so powerful: The world spends plenty of time telling us lies about power, value, and love. But baptism speaks a different word: Grace. God's grace is a still, small voice that never tires of pushing through our phony labels with what's good and true and lasts forever. Reed, you've been marked with the cross of Christ and sealed by the Holy Spirit forever. Thank God for the gift of community!

We are excited to have fall parent teacher conferences for the first time in preschool. This is in addition to our usual early spring conferences. Hopefully we can learn more about our students and share the amazing progress they are making in preschool.

We will have no shortage of fun in November as we will go bear hunting, learn about habitats, and have a special Donuts with Daddies Day! And, of course, we will be reminding the students of all the things we have to be thankful for and we will be having our own version of a Thanksgiving Feast.

We then will be wasting no time talking about the birth of the baby Jesus. The last week of November will be all about the Nativity.

Happy November!

The Pre-K room has reviewed letters A-H, and are working on numbers every day during calendar time. We learned 12 new sight words and I am teaching them how to write a sentence using these words. I also teach them how to draw something that goes with the sentence. Each week they begin a new book that goes with the letter. They learn lots of things that start with each letter and begin to be early readers. They have a box that they painted and it was sent home with a few of their first books. We continue to read and color these books. Then after we have read them for a couple weeks, they go home to be put in their box and read or sing every night.

One theme has been D is for dig. Students brought items we could smell, touch and see. Then they draw one thing and write at least the first letter it starts with. They played with dominoes, dice, dot-to-dot pages, dug for dinosaurs in our playground, played with these dough mats and made beautiful faces. They also learned a lot about dinosaurs and dogs.

The next letter was B for bounce. They brought bouncy balls to try to keep them up in the air, but gravity keeps bringing them down. They also balanced bean bags, tried to keep balloons from hitting the ground. Students bring things to our science center that start with B. They draw one and write the first letter the object starts with. We also did some art with colored bubble solution. These works of art are hanging up in the hallway!

The next letter I was for insect. Friends were to bring dead or alive insects to look at in the science center. We learned a lot about insects. We also did an experiment with ice. The students predicted if the ice would melt faster with water, salt, sugar or baking soda. Then we did the experiment to find out if our predictions were correct. We discussed solid, liquid and gas. We let the ice melt and eventually evaporate.

Lastly, we will be celebrating H is for Halloween with fun Halloween stories, carving pumpkins, singing songs and playing games. Plus, we have made some fall decorations and had a blast in Pre-K!

November means we will be talking about how thankful we are for everything that God has provided us! Have a blessed November!
