COUNCIL UPDATE

Council Report – A 'Yes' Vote & Special Needs Fund

Greetings First Lutheran Congregation,

The biggest news from November came in the form of a 'yes' vote from the congregation. At our congregational meeting on November 6th, we had 88 people vote in favor (compared to 31 opposed) of moving forward with the office remodel, HVAC upgrades, and capital campaign. Now, the capital campaign team will begin working on next steps. We will keep the congregation well informed of the progress with regular communication. Thanks to all who helped plan for this project, prayed, asked good questions, and voted. We felt God with us through this process and now we move forward with confidence.

At our November council meeting, we turned our attention to 3 more endowment requests, which were approved. We also spent time discussing the Special Needs Fund. This fund was established to help individuals within our church family as well as the outside community. When someone is in need of short-term financial assistance, such as help paying a utility bill, filling up their car with gas in order to get to work safely, or any other basic needs, our pastors and staff have these funds available. In recent years, we have actually provided money from this line to the Jubilee Center. Jubilee has a well-established process which connects with other services they provide to help people in need. So now, when members of the community ask our church for assistance, we can direct them to the Jubilee Center for a more well-rounded response to their needs. It also frees up our staff from getting caught up in the logistics of these requests, which can take up a lot of time and energy. It's important to note, however, that members of the congregation who are in need can still seek this type of help directly from our church office. We are discreet with these interactions.

Please consider making a separate donation to the Special Needs Fund during the holidays. It is a fund that is used consistently, and currently running low. There are plenty of people living in poverty here in Kearney. God calls us to provide for those in need. Giving specifically to this fund is a great way to serve our community and honor God. Thanks for your consideration!

Speaking of the holidays, we pray that you all find peace and joy during this special Christmas season. There are so many wonderful events within the church and community to help you feel more connected to Christ. Please keep an eye on the calendar and find ways to get involved. As we know from the quoted words of Jesus in Acts 20:35, *it is more blessed to give than to receive*.

WORSHIP THEMES

December 4, 2022 SECOND SUNDAY OF ADVENT

ISAIAH 11:1-10; PSALM 72:1-7, 18-19; ROMANS 15:4-13; MATTHEW 3:1-12

At the heart of our Advent preparation stands John the Baptist, who calls us to repent and make a new beginning. As the darkness increases, we turn toward the approaching light of Christ. For Christians he is the root of Jesse, the righteous judge who welcomes all, especially the poor and the meek of the earth. We wait with hope for that day when the wolf will dwell with the lamb, and there will be no more hurt or destruction. From the Lord's table we are sent in the spirit of John the Baptism to proclaim that in Christ the kingdom of God has come near.

December 11, 2022 THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

ISAIAH 35:1-10; PSALM 146:5-10; JAMES 5:7-10; MATTHEW 11:2-11

A note of joyful expectation marks today's worship. Isaiah announces that the desert shall rejoice and blossom, and Jesus points to the unexpected and transforming signs of God's reign. We wait with patience for the coming of the Lord, even as we rejoice at his presence among us this day: in word and holy supper, in church and in our homes, in silent reflection and in works of justice and love. We pray that God would open our eyes and ears to the wonders of Christ's advent among us.



December 18, 2022 FOURTH SUNDAY OF ADVENT

ISAIAH 7:10-16; PSALM 80: 1-7, 17-19; ROMANS 1:1-7; MATTHEW 1:18-25

Today Isaiah prophesies that a young woman will bear a son and name him Emmanuel. The gospel is Matthew's account of the annunciation and birth of the one named Emmanuel, God-with-us. During these final days of Advent we pray, "O come, O come, Emmanuel," a beloved hymn based on the O Antiphons, ancient prayers appointed for the seven days preceding Christmas. On this final Sunday of Advent, we prepare to celebrate the birth of the one born to save us from the power of sin and death.

December 25, 2022 NATIVITY OF OUR LORD.

CHRISTMAS DAY

ISAIAH 62:6-12; PSALM 97, TITUS 3:4-7; LUKE 2:[1-7]8-20;

As on the first day of creation, on this Christmas Day the Word illumines the world, shining forth to bring all things into being. Today we celebrate the incarnate Word, God becoming flesh to live along us in the person of Jesus Christ then and now. Emboldened by the good news of Christ's birth, along with the shepherds, Mary and Joseph, and all witnesses to the light of Christ, we declare to the world that we have indeed seen and been transformed by the arrival of "the salvation of our God," O come, let us adore!

As the semester wraps up, more thank you's are necessary – for:


Our Stewardship Team who faithfully guide our work in ministry, mission, finances, and maintaining a complicated physical building;
