Adult Forum – Sunday, March 12th @ 9:45am

Mae Helen Jackson is the outreach and placement manager for <u>Young Adult Ministries</u> with <u>the</u> <u>Evangelical Lutheran Church in America</u> and has worked for the ELCA for over 5 years. Mae Helen's role is to recruit and build relationships for <u>Young Adults in Global Mission</u> (YAGM) specifically, and ELCA Young Adult Ministry more broadly.

YAGM is a global fellowship program for young adults aged 21-29, providing them an opportunity to spend a year in accompaniment with one of ELCA's global church companions. For 20+ years they have had the pleasure of sending young adults around the world to accompany and experience life with companions in over 20 country programs. In 2022, on September 7th, YAGM deployed 24 young adults to 4 country programs for the first time since the start of the COVID pandemic in 2020. They are excited for the opportunity connect more young adults in these, and newer, communities this year.

COUNCIL UPDATE

Budget Planning Begins

While it's not always fun talking about budget plans in the Church, it certainly is an important part of our ministry. Afterall, God calls us to be good stewards of the gifts we receive. Giving of the resources that God has entrusted to us is an important part of our faith journey. It allows us to carry out the ministry work of the church and serve others in the congregation, community, and the world. So then, what can we do with those gifts?

In the coming months, this year's budget committee will begin reviewing the budget requests from our Ministry Teams and putting together a balanced budget plan for the council and congregation to review. This is usually a great challenge as the requests and needs of the Church often exceed projected giving and available funds.

The next fiscal year will bring its own assortment of challenges as we balance a capital campaign, staffing changes, continued maintenance needs, and unpredictable giving trends (as seen in churches across the nation).

Fortunately, we have a history of a generous and faithful congregation here at First Lutheran. In my time serving on council, we have asked the congregation several times to answer the call when special financial needs arise. We've replaced carpet, boiler units, 100% of the roof, fire alarm system, lighting, and more. We've brought on additional staff and an associate pastor to enhance our ministry. We've created a strong endowment fund. We've ran "Finish Strong" campaigns when we thought the annual budget would come up short. Each time, this congregation comes forward with the resources necessary.

As we prepare for the road ahead on which God is leading us, we respectfully ask you to keep our Church in your prayers. We ask God to help and guide us through the best ways to utilize the gifts we receive. May we make sound decisions that continue to enhance our ministry, improve our facilities, grow our church, connect with the community, and share God's word as far and wide as possible.

Each of us has an important role to play in this faith journey together. We appreciate your continued prayers and support of the work being done at First Lutheran. As more specific budget updates become available, we will keep you all informed and invite you to provide feedback.

WORSHIP THEMES

February 5, 2023 FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

ISAIAH 58:1-9a [9b-12]; PSALM 112:1-9[10]; 1 CORINTHIANS 2:1-12 [13-16]; MATTHEW 5:13-20

Light shines in the darkness for the upright, the psalmist sings. Isaiah declares that when we lose the bonds of injustice and share our bread with the hungry, the light breaks forth like the dawn. In another passage from the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus, the light of the world, calls his followers to let the light of their good works shine before others. Through baptism we are sent into the world to shine with the light of Christ.

February 12, 2023 SIXTH SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

DEUTERONOMY 30:15-20; PSALM 119:1-18; 1 CORINTHIANS 3:1-9; MATTHEW 5:21-37

In today's reading from Deuteronomy, we are called to choose life by loving and obeying God. Much of today's gospel reading echoes portions of the Ten Commandments. Jesus' instructions to the crowd reveal a pattern of behavior that honors both God and the neighbor, resulting in life and health for the whole community. We too are invited to embrace these commandments, not out of fear of retribution, but because God has promised that to do so means life for us.

February 19, 2023

TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD; LAST SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

EXODUS 24:12-18; PSALM 2; 2 PETER 1:16-21; MATTHEW 17:1-9

Today's festival is a bridge between the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany cycle that comes to a close today and the Lent-Easter cycle that begins in several days. On a high mountain Jesus is revealed as God's beloved Son, echoing the words at his baptism. The vision of glory sustains us as Jesus faces his impending death in Jerusalem. We turn this week to Ash Wednesday and our yearly baptismal journey from Lent to Easter. Some churches put aside the alleluia at the conclusion of today's liturgy. This world of joy will be omitted during the penitential season of Lent and will be sung again at Easter.

February 26, 2023 FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT

GENESIS 2:15-17; 3:1-7; PSALM 32; ROMANS 5:12-19; MATTHEW 4:1-11

Today's gospel tells of Jesus' temptation in the desert. His forty-day fast becomes the basis of our Lenten pilgrimage. In the early church Lent was a time of intense preparation for those to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. This catechetical focus on the meaning of faith is at the heart of our Lenten journey to the baptismal waters of Easter. Hungry for God's mercy, we receive the bread of life to nourish us for the days ahead.

Equal Exchange believes in fairness to farmers and has been selling products since 1986. They also believe in educating consumers about trade issues and are a company that is controlled by the people who do the actual work in their operation

The Nebraska Synodical Women's Organization has supported Fair Trade for many years. We have proudly promoted products at NSWO events and encouraged their use in our congregational units. Products we currently promote at NSWO events are coffee, tea, chocolate, olive oil, dried fruits, nuts and spices. All purchased from Equal Exchange. We encourage and empower "YOU" to bring fairly traded products to "YOUR" churches and communities. If we can bring Fair Trade into our surroundings we can be "MORE" supportive of the process!


