Faithful Living, Joyful Giving

Over the last couple of weeks, Renae Zimmer who is our chair of the Inspiration Team for the Capital Campaign, has been leading a Bible Study on faithful living and joyful giving. This Bible Study (*Faithful Living*, *Joyful Giving*) was written by Dr. Katherine O. Conrad. I thought one of the stories included in the study was worth sharing here.

Myrtle and Milton were both legally blind and worked in a sheltered workshop. They were very happy in their work, their small apartment, and in their church. Then, suddenly, Milton died. Myrtle was heartbroken over losing her soul—mate, but she was very brave and greatly comforted by her faith in God. A young woman who worked in the office at the workshop helped Myrtle with the paperwork related to Milton's death. When the insurance check for \$8,000 came, she went with Myrtle to the bank to deposit the check. When they got back to Myrtle's apartment she said, "Laura, right now, write out a check to my church for \$800 and put it in my Sunday pocketbook. I can't wait to put it in the offering plate Sunday." Laura, herself a tither, said, "Myrtle, I know you want to give something to your church, but don't you think you should wait a little while to make sure all of your bills have been paid?" Myrtle replied, "Laura, the Lord does not wait to send me blessings. I won't wait to thank Him."

Jesus has important things to say about money, too. In the $12^{\rm th}$ chapter of Mark, Jesus also tells the story of a widow:

⁴¹He [Jesus] sat down opposite the treasury, and watched the crowd putting money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. ⁴²A poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which are worth a penny. ⁴³Then he called his disciples and said to them, "Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. ⁴⁴For all of them have contributed out of their abundance; but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on."

As we enter into this capital campaign season here at First Lutheran, what will your mindset be? Will it be a mindset of responding to God's love and grace in generous ways?



COUNCIL UPDATE

New Staff Positions Created and Budget Gets Endorsed

Greetings First Lutheran Congregation,

Last summer, the council appointed a taskforce to plan for future staffing needs. The goal of this taskforce was to create an ideal organizational chart for the growing and evolving needs of the church. With recent staff changes, these efforts were unexpectedly put in motion early. As a result, the taskforce and personnel committee worked collaboratively on creating two new staff positions for First Lutheran.

The first newly created position is *Director of Communications and Events*. This full-time position consists of several communications-type job responsibilities that have been abandoned over the last few years when our previous Executive Director position was vacated and left unfilled. Additionally, this new position will handle responsibilities related to the facility and preparing it for all activities within the church. Once hired, this new position will take a lot of pressure off our current staff and pastors who are all juggling excessive workloads.

This part-time position will assist with a variety of activities related to worship and Christian education. With a focus on bringing people together to serve God and others, this position is responsible for engaging with the congregation, recruiting helpers, and creating a positive experience for guests and attendees.

With these two new staff positions joining our existing staff, we'll be better positioned to grow our congregation, serve the Church, and expand our ministry efforts. This prayerful process of reviewing our current and future staffing needs has been a spiritually uplifting exercise and we feel very positive about the direction Christ is leading us. The job search for these two new positions is underway and we'll keep everyone informed as things develop.

Additionally, the council recently endorsed the next fiscal year budget. The budget committee met in early March and prepared the initial draft of the budget for review. Then, the council endorsed it at the March council meeting. Next, the congregation will get a chance to review it at the Budget Forum on June 11th between services. The budget will be finalized after a vote to approve at the congregational annual meeting on June 25th. Next year's budget looks similar to this year's. With a \$14,000 increase in spending, we are hoping to maximize our output without stretching our budget too much. More details will be made available at the Budget Forum.

And finally, we appreciate everyone's prayers as we continue to guide the Church in a direction, we feel God is leading us. As the Easter season reminds us each year, this is a time of hope, faith, and renewal. The next several months will bring a great challenge as we embark on a capital campaign. May your hope and faith guide you as you consider supporting this effort.

WORSHIP THEMES

April 2, 2023 SUNDAY OF THE PASSION, PALM SUNDAY

MATTHEW 21:1-11; PSALM 31:9-16; PHILIPPIANS 2:5-11; MATTHEW 26:14-27:66

Today, we encounter the paradox that defines our faith: Jesus Christ is glorified king and humiliated servant. We too are full of paradox: like Peter, we fervently desire to follow Christ, but find ourselves afraid, denying God. We wave palms in celebration today as Christ comes into our midst, and we follow with trepidation as his path leads to death on the cross. Amid it all we are invited into this paradoxical promise of life through Christ's broken body and outpoured love in a meal of bread and wine. We begin this week that stands at the center of the church year, anticipating the completion of God's astounding work.

April 9, 2023 RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD

ACTS 10:34-43; PSALM 118:1-2, 14-24; COLOSSIANS 3:1-4; MATTHEW 28:1-10

This is the day the Lord has made! Christ is risen, and through him all creation is made new! Indeed, "God shows no partiality" (Acts 10:34): Christ's resurrection truly brings life to everyone. We sing hymns of praise, gather around sacred words, and proclaim God's faithfulness, power, and love in the feast of holy communion. With the women at the tomb, we are astonished, elated, and grateful. We depart with joy to proclaim the good news of God's endless love.



April 16, 2023 SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

ACTS 2:14a, 22-32, PSALM 16, 1 PETER 1:3-9; JOHN 20:19-31

In today's gospel the risen Christ appears to the disciples and offers them the gift of peace. Even amid doubts and questions, we experience the resurrection in our Sunday gathering around word and meal, and in our everyday lives. Throughout the coming Sundays of Easter, the first two readings will be from the Acts of Apostles and the first letter of Peter. Even as the early Christians proclaimed the resurrection, we rejoice in the new birth and living hope we receive in baptism.

April 23, 2023

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

ACTS 2:14a, 36-41; PSALM 116:1-4, 12-19, 1 PETER 1:17-23; LUKE 24:13-35

Today's gospel begins with two disciples walking to Emmaus, overcome with sadness, loss, and disappointment. They had hoped Jesus, who was crucified, would be the one to redeem Israel! Yet the risen Christ walks with them and then opens their eyes in the breaking of the bread. Each Sunday our hearts burn within us as the scriptures are proclaimed and Christ appears to us as bread is broken and wine is poured. The story of Emmaus becomes the pattern worship each Lord's day.

April 30, 2023 FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

ACTS 2:42-47; PSALM 23; 1 PETER 2:19-25; JOHN 10:1-10

Today is sometimes called "Good Shepherd Sunday," Jesus is called the "gate" of the sheet in today's gospel. The risen Christ opens the way to abundant life. He anoints our heads with oil and guides us beside the still waters of baptism. Each Sunday he spreads a feast before us amid the world's violence and war. We go forth to be signs of the resurrection and extend God's tender care to all creation.

WOMEN of the ELCA

One portion of the Women of the ELCA purpose statement is to engage in ministry and action, and promote healing and wholeness in the world. One group that engages in action to promote healing is the quilting group. Each quilt measures 60" X80" and are made using a top, filler and a back. The quilt tops are twelve 21" blocks sewn together. The inside filler can be old blankets, batting or any heavy fabric. The quilt backs are usually sheets or any other large piece of fabric. Once the layers are stacked and pinned, they are tied using crochet thread. Typically, there are five ties per square. After the tying is complete the quilts are machine stitched around the edges to create the binding Quilts have been sent to Angolo, Aremia, Burkina Farsa, Guatemala, Haiti, Niger, Sierra Leone, and Tanzania. time, compassion and prayer that is dedicated to each quilt used by families world's away in times of their darkest hours brings reminders of God's grace and love. If you would like to join this group to help, bring God's love to others, they meet on the first Monday of the month from 8:30 - 11:15. No sewing skills are required. They would love the help as they are a small group.
