MISSION OUTREACH OPPORTUNITIES HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

Thank you to First Lutheran members who provided the meal to Habitat on June 17 and to Pastor Rick for the morning devotion. We continue to look for organizations or businesses that would volunteer to provide a Saturday lunch in the second half of the building season.

As this update is written in mid-June, progress continues for the three houses of 2023. Houses #95 and #96 are enclosed so there is a workspace even in rainy weather. House #95 is focused on insulation, drywall, and painting. Once the electrical work is completed in House #96 there will be insulation, drywall, and painting to do. Did you know that each house has a "safe room" where a family can shelter during heavy storms? The closet in one bedroom is reinforced to protect residents. By July the footings for House #97 will be dug and the slab poured.

While the families are working on their physical houses, they are also working to strengthen their financial house. Each family is studying the Fannie Mae program while they track their spending and build budgets. The families meet two or three times to share their questions and discuss their progress.

ROYAL FAMILY KIDS CAMP

Mission Outreach Team has chosen Royal Family Kids Camp as the special summer project for 2023. RFK is a Christian led organization that provides a week-long summer camp for children ages 7-11 who are involved with the child welfare system. This year's Kearney area camp is July 24-28, 2023. They also serve children in Kearney through a monthly mentoring club during the school year.

RFKC is a network of camps, children's clubs, and child mentoring for abused, abandoned and neglected children in the foster care, system. Their motto is "Every child deserves dignity", and the goal is for every child in the community to experience unconditional love, hope, and safety. Royal Family KIDS Kearney's mission is to create lifechanging moments for children who have experienced relational trauma. They are motivated by the example Christ set to share a common goal, of caring for those Jesus referred to as, "the least of these."

A COUNCIL UPDATE Budget Revisions, Supporting, NLOM, and Capital Campaign Next Steps

Greetings First Lutheran Congregation,

At our June council meeting we reviewed an updated budget plan. As we discussed at the congregational budget forum, we revealed that the Associate Pastor for Youth and Young Adult ministry position will likely be structured differently than it was during Pastor Elisabeth's call. It will not be a split call with Campus Lutheran. Therefore, we will not be receiving reimbursement from the grant or from synod to help offset the salary. With that known, we adjusted our projected revenue accordingly.

Our planned expenses are only \$11,500 higher than the previous year, which is an increase of 1.4%. We know we'll have salary savings while we go through the call process to fill the open Associate Pastor position so the expenses at the end of this fiscal year should be even lower than our plan shows. As always, we'll keep a close eye on expenses compared to giving/revenue in the early months to make sure we're on track.

The council also approved an Endowment request for \$3,000 supporting Nebraska Lutheran Outdoor Ministries. First Lutheran has participated in camp for many years. Our 7th graders just finished a week at Camp Carol Joy Holling in June and we heard it was another wonderful experience. We are grateful to have opportunities to support NLOM.

Additionally, the council had extensive conversation about the Capital Campaign. Specifically, what are the next steps? We will be forming a building committee soon to explore next steps, get final plans drawn, approach contractors about bids, etc. We have over \$1.2 Million collected in intent cards. This is wonderful to see and we're grateful for the generous contributions from the congregation. However, there's still a way to go to hit our goal of over \$2 Million. We'll keep the congregation informed of plans moving forward and efforts to help us reach our goal.

Finally, we celebrated the outgoing council representatives. We are grateful for the work that Mark Kottmeyer, Rachel Leach, and Mike Rafferty did during their years serving the church. They navigated the difficulty of COVID-19 and helped our church through many tough, important decisions. Similarly, we celebrated the work of Pastor Elisabeth. We are blessed to have had her serve our church and community. We wish her well in her next call.

We pray that summer is treating everyone well. The work of the church remains busy during these months with planning for VBS, answering the needs of our church members, and preparing for fall activities. Thank you all for your continued prayers.

In today's gospel Jesus offers everyday images that reveal to us the reign of God: a tree that becomes a sheltering home, yeast that penetrates and expands, a treasured pearl, a net that gains a great catch. Even as we seek the riches of God's reign, the great surprise is that God's grace finds us first!

If you like going to garage sales, look for and purchase the following items for the Infant Care kits. Items needed are lightweight tshirts, receiving blankets, socks, sleepers, from infant to 24 months. NO onesies or sleepers with feet. School items will soon be on sale for the School kits. Items needed are #2 pencils unsharpened with erasers, ballpoint pens, 16 or 24 crayons, 70 sheet notebooks, blunt scissors. Drawstring backpacks or canvas material to make backpacks is also needed. Personal Care Kits also need light to medium weight dark color bath towels. Combs and nail clippers are also needed. There are collection boxes in the coffee area by the pop machine.

There is a Saved to Serve event on Friday, August 4, 6pm, to Sunday, August 6, 1pm at Mosaic at Bethpage Village in Axtell. On Saturday, there will be a carnival for the individuals living at the Village. They will also be sprucing up some landscaping, do some cleaning and prepare greeting cards to make holidays special. There is a tangible offering of fun socks from age 9 to 90, regular size bath towels, and Beanie Babies. Registration forms are available on the Women of the ELCA bulletin board by the office and are due July 14.
