

Ashlea Denton Joins Staff as Faith in Action Coordinator and Interim FLY Coordinator



It is with great joy that we announce the hiring of Ashlea Combs Denton as our Faith in Action Coordinator. As well, Ashlea has enthusiastically agreed to serve as our Transitional Youth Ministry Coordinator with FLY for up to one year.

Ashlea grew up in Kearney and her family joined First Lutheran when she was in elementary school, participating in Sunday School and Confirmation. She spent her high school years participating in FLY. After that, she went on to Northwestern College in Iowa to earn a BA in Religion and Cultural Studies. Her educational background also includes a Master of Arts in Children, Youth, and Family Ministry from Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN. Some of her previous work experience includes an internship in Jackson, Mississippi, where she served as support staff for the Homeless Ministry and community development. She also served with AmeriCorps in New Orleans, was a supervisor for the Boys and Girls Club in Chadron, as well as a youth group leader in Minnesota. Ashlea and her husband, Chris, returned to the Kearney area and grew their family roots with their children Henry, Magdalena, and Wilhelmina.

In her position of Faith in Action Coordinator (part-time), Ashlea will be recruiting volunteers; coordinate Christian Education programming and new programs; among many other things. In her position as Transitional Youth Ministry Coordinator, Ashlea will guide adult volunteers in their work with the youth, lead FLY Wednesday evenings and some Sunday mornings, and coordinate the logistics of the Youth Gathering in 2024. Pastor Rick will be the staff member accompanying our youth to New Orleans with parent volunteers.

We give thanks to God for planting such a gift in our midst to shape the new Faith in Action position as well as shepherding our youth through this time of change. Ashlea's official first day will be August 1st. Please welcome her warmly.

A COUNCIL UPDATE

Staff Changes, Building Committee, and Call Process

Greetings First Lutheran Congregation,

Our new staff structure continues to take shape with the addition of Ashlea Denton as our Faith in Action Coordinator. This new position will focus on recruiting volunteers and creating/enhancing programming at First Lutheran. Additionally, Ashlea has agreed to be the Transitional FLY (First Lutheran Youth) Coordinator for the upcoming year while we enter a call process for an associate pastor or deacon.

While that position has now been filled, we sadly accepted Marti Brockmeier's resignation as bookkeeper. Marti served faithfully in that role for 9.5 years and was a continuous bright spot in the office. Her last day in the office will be August 24th and she will be instrumental in training her replacement. A search for that replacement is already underway.

Speaking of bookkeeping, we have been focused on cleaning up our escrow accounts. The church has dozens of escrow lines with restricted funds dedicated to them for things like computer technology needs, pastor book allowances, camp scholarships, and bell choir, just to name a few. These escrow lines are not tied to the annual budget in any way, rather they are funds that can be accessed on an as-needed basis. Over the years, some escrow lines have gone unused with money just sitting there. Marti is helping us determine which lines can be closed out and where those funds can be transferred and better utilized.

Additionally, the council spent time discussing next steps for the capital campaign. The Building Committee will be meeting soon to explore next steps in the construction process. There are fairly urgent needs related to the HVAC system that we'd like to address as soon as possible. This committee will be instrumental in leading this effort.

Finally, as mentioned above we have our transitional FLY coordinator in place for the upcoming year, but we will be starting a call process for the next associate pastor or deacon soon. We have a meeting set with a synod representative who will go over the next steps for that. Be on the lookout for information related to the call committee. We ask that you all prayerfully consider volunteering to serve on this team. The council will select a call committee from the list of all who are interested.

We are eager to see educational programming like FROG, Sunday School, and Confirmation start back up. It's spiritually uplifting to see full classrooms and event spaces throughout the church. A special thank you to all our volunteers who help teach, prepare Wednesday evening meals, assist with worship, or fill a committee role. Our ministry can't be successful without your dedication. As always, we appreciate the support and prayers from the congregation.

August 6, 2023 TIME AFTER PENTECOST

ISAIAH 55:1-5; PSALM 145:8-9, 14-21; ROMANS 9:1-5; MATTHEW 14:13-21

In today's first reading God invites all who are hungry or thirsty to receive food and drink without cost. Jesus feeds the hungry multitude and reveals the abundance of God. At the eucharistic table we remember all who are hungry or poor in our world today. As we share the bread of life, we are sent forth to give ourselves away as bread for the hungry.

August 13, 2023 TIME AFTER PENTECOST

1 KINGS 19:9-18; PSALM 85:8-13; ROMANS 10:5-15; MATTHEW 14:22-23

Elijah finds the presence of God not in earthquake, wind, or fire, but in the sound of sheer silence. When the disciples face a great storm on the sea, they cry out with fear, Jesus says: "Take heart, it is I; do not be afraid." Amid the storms of life, we gather to seek the calm presence of Christ that soothes our fears. In comforting words of scripture and in the refreshing bread and cup of the eucharist, God grants us peace and sends us forth to be a sign of God's presence to others.



August 20, 2023 TIME AFTER PENTECOST

ISAIAH 56:1, 6-8; PSALM 67; ROMANS 11:1-2a, 29-32; MATTHEW 15:[10-20] 21-28

In Isaiah we hear that God's house shall be a house of prayer for all people and that God will gather the outcasts of Israel. The Canaanite woman in today's gospel is a Gentile, an outsider, who is unflinching in her request that Jesus heal her daughter. As Jesus commends her bold faith, how might our church extend its mission to those on margins of society? In our gathering around word and meal we receive strength to be signs of comfort, healing, and justice for those in need.

August 27, 2023 TIME AFTER PENTECOST

ISAIAH 51:1-6; PSALM 138; ROMANS 12:1-8; MATTHEW 16:13-20

In Isaiah the people are advised to look to their spiritual ancestors as the rock from which they were hewn. Jesus declares that the church will be built on the rock of Peter's bold confession of faith. God's word of reconciliation and God's mercy are keys to the church's mission. Paul urges us to not be conformed to this world; but to offer our bodies as a living sacrifice, using our individual gifts to build up the body of Christ. From the table we go forth to offer our spiritual worship through word and deed.

First Lutheran Youth Take Mission Trip to Nashville by Miranda Wright

FLY spent the week of June 24-July 1 on a mission trip in Nashville, Tennessee. It was filled with laughter, service, and LOTS of Jesus. When departing from the church on Saturday the 24th, we were fully prepared for a week of fun serving and growing on our faith journey. We stopped for the night at a church called Good Shepherd Lutheran Church, where we were welcomed with open arms. We devoured pre-made lasagna meals prepared by families of our youth group. Before leaving the suburb of St. Louis, Missouri we attended the early service at

Good Shepard where we got to see how other Lutheran churches run things. We then traveled the last 5 hours to the Music City, Nashville.

During the week, we spent about 5 hours at our service sites each day with our assigned groups. Our work groups were named after famous country singers, like Rascal Flats and Dolly Parton. Some projects various groups took part in included: organizing and making meals at a homeless shelter, doing yard work, cleaning, sorting medical supplies at project search, playing with kids at day-camps, teaching kids how to read, and putting away stuff at a ministry site. Helping at the different sites was an eye-opening experience seeing the impact that we made doing such small projects.

My group was assigned the Shelby Park Community Center for the first 3 days where we hung out with kids ages 6-14 and then a place called Jesus Provisions Ministries for the last day where we sorted supplies and created VBS plans. The community center was created for low-income families to have free child care where their kids could get 2 free meals a day and get lot of physical activity. The rest of the week, my group was assigned to Jesus Provisions Ministries. It is a non-profit organization that was started for families that needed food and clothes but couldn't afford it. It now has grown, and they have been able to provide a hot meal and service every Sunday morning for the homeless people in Nashville. Not only did our groups provide help and service to others, we got to learn about others stories and see things in a different light.

First Lutheran Youth Take Mission Trip to Nashville (continued)

During our free time, we got to visit Centennial Park and, of course, downtown Broadway as a church group. While downtown, you could definitely tell we were tourists because of how giddy we were and how many photos we took. The sights were incredible during the sunsets. It was filled with live music everywhere you went.

One of the most memorable moments of the entire trip was worship and church group time. Worship was just like any other church service, filled with music and learning about the Bible. However, one night stood out to me the most. It was the last night before we left to head home the next morning. They had chosen to talk about John 13, particularly John 13, verses 1–5. "Then he poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples feet and wipe them with the towel that was wrapped around him". When we went into church group time, our pastor(s) washed our feet and prayed over us just like Jesus had done to his disciples. It was an especially emotional night for our group as it was one of our last with Pastor Elisabeth. God worked through us that week in many, many ways. Going on this trip was a once in a life time experience, and it was definitely a trip I will never forget!
