MISSION OUTREACH OPPORTUNITIES:

Lutheran Disaster Response/ Maui Wildfires

Multiple wildfires have broken out on the Hawaiian island of Maui. Exacerbated by strong winds, wildfires on Maui have claimed dozens of lives and have destroyed homes, businesses and lines of communication. Thousands of people are under evacuation orders, some moving to other Hawaiian islands. Wildfires have also affected the Big Island of Hawaii, and the islands remain vulnerable to more fires this season.

Lutheran Disaster Response is coordinating with the Pacifica Synod and other partners to assess the needs of people impacted by the wildfires. We will work with them to provide for immediate needs and recovery amid the widespread destruction. Lutheran Disaster Response is committed to accompanying recovering communities in the years ahead.

MISSION OUTREACH OPPORTUNITIES: HABITAT FOR HUMANITY



This is a month of many happenings for Kearney Habitat.

First, please pray for good health for several long-time Habitat volunteers who are experiencing serious health problems this year.

Next, we want to recognize the honor that Jerry Marlatt with the support of the Building Crew volunteers will receive from Nebraska AARP on October 19th at the build site, as an outstanding example of retired individuals who continue to stay active through service to their community. Along with this honor comes an award of \$2,500. It's not too early to mention Give Where You Live, when local donors make a large contribution to the Kearney Habitat effort. This year GWYL will be on December 6.

Again, week after week, the volunteers have come together on Tuesday and Thursday mornings as well as Saturdays to build three houses for our community. Most outside work has been finished except for landscaping. Flooring, kitchen cabinets, countertops and appliances are being installed. Closet shelves and doorlocks, interior painting and clean up are in progress. Dedications will be held in November.

Lastly, foundations for two three-bedroom houses are poured for two new housebuilders in 2024. There is still room for one additional housebuilder in 2023.

A COUNCIL UPDATE Pizza and Possibilities

Greetings First Lutheran Congregation,

Have you ever tried to assume too much control over your own life? That can become a common theme for people. Feeling the need to force decisions or actions that work for what WE want right NOW in our lives. The hard part is that what WE want is not always in line with what God wants for us. That's when it's important to take a moment and be still. To reflect. To engage in prayer. And to ask ourselves "what is God leading us to do in this moment?"

That's the approach that our leadership team is taking with the upcoming call process to bring a new Associate Pastor for Youth and Young Adult Ministry to First Lutheran. Fortunately, the Synod Office has an excellent guide to help congregations navigate the call process. It includes multiple phases and is truly a road map to show us the best path forward.

In one of the early phases, it's recommended that we host a "Telling Our Story" event. At this event, congregants meet and discuss the church throughout the decades. Sometimes it can help to reflect on where we've been in order to better determine where we're going.

After that, we gather information to help us write the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). This becomes the document that describes who we are and what we're looking for. It's the document that pastoral candidates will look at and decide if we would be a good match. The MSP needs to be a reflection of the congregation as a whole. It's YOUR thoughts, ideas, attitudes, and preferences that need to be represented.

With that in mind, we hope you will be actively engaged in our call process. Make plans to attend the "Telling Our Story" event on November 12th. We're calling it "Pizza and Possibilities." It will include – you guessed it – pizza served for lunch before we discuss the amazing possibilities that we hope to encounter as a church. We look forward to sharing memories of the past and looking ahead to what God is calling us to do together. It's a very important event and we hope you can join us!

In addition to the call process, we continued to be focused on the Capital Campaign and Office/HVAC building projects. Our Building Committee is meeting again and working on getting updated bids and discussing steps for construction. We'll share more details as they become available. Please keep praying for our staff and pastors for the work they're doing on behalf of our congregation and community.

WORSHIP THEMES

October 1, 2023 TIME AFTER PENTECOST EZEKIEL 18:1-4, 25-32; PSALM

EZEKIEL 18:1-4, 25-32; PSALM 25:1-9; PHILIPPIANS 2:1-13; MATTHEW 21:23-32

Jesus' parable about two sons who don't do what they say reveals surprises in the reign of God. In the reading from Ezekiel the people claim the ways of the Lord are unfair, while God offers repentance and new life. Paul urges us to look to Christ as a model of humility, putting the interests of others above our own. Nourished by the broken bread and shared cup, we offer our lives for the sake of our needy world.

October 8, 2023 TIME AFTER PENTECOST

ISAIAH 5:1-7; PSALM 80:7-15; PHILIPPIANS 3:4B-14; MATTHEW 21:33-46

In today's gospel reading, Jesus tells a vineyard parable, which serves as an image of Israel, the prophets' mission, and Christ's death. For Christians, the vineyard also speaks of God's love poured out in the blood of Christ, given to us for the forgiveness of sin. Grafted onto Christ the vine at baptism, we are nourished with wine and bread so that we may share Christ's sufferings and know the power of his resurrection.

October 15, 2023 TIME AFTER PENTECOST

ISAIAH 25:1-9; PSALM 23; PHILIPPIANS 4:1-9; MATTHEW 22:1-14

In Isaiah we are given a vision of the great feast to come, when God will wipe away death forever. In Jesus' parable about a great banquet, those invited do not come, so the invitation is extended to others. In our liturgy God spreads a table before us. Even amid anxiety and hardship

we rejoice in the peace of God which surpasses all under-standing. With great joy we feast at the table of the Lord, and we go forth to share the wonderful invitation with others hungering and thirsting for the abundant life of God

October 22, 2023 TIME AFTER PENTECOST ISAIAH 45:1-7; PSALM 96:1-9 [10-13]; 1 THESSALONIANS 1:1-10; MATTHEW 22:15-22

In today's first reading God uses the Gentile ruler Cyrus to accomplish divine purposes. When the Pharisees try to trap Jesus, he tells them to give the emperor what belongs to him and to God what belongs to God. To gather for worship reminds us that our ultimate allegiance is to God rather than to any earthly authority. Created in the image of God, we offer our entire selves in the service of God and for the sake of the world.

October 29, 2023 REFORMATION SUNDAY


JEREMIAH 31:31-34; PSALM 46; ROMANS 3:19-28; JOHN 8:31-36


