

## **WORSHIP THEMES**

January 7, 2024 FIRST SUNDAY AFTER EPHIPHANY

GENESIS 1:1-5; PSALM 29; ACTS 19:1-7; MARK 1:4-11

Our re-creation in baptism is an image of the Genesis creation, where the Spirit moved over the waters. Both Mark's gospel and the story in acts make clear that it is the Spirit's movement that distinguishes Jesus' baptism from John's. The Spirit has come upon us as upon Jesus and the Ephesians, calling us God's beloved children and setting us on Jesus' mission to re-create the world in the image of God's vision of justice and peace.

#### January 14, 2024

SECOND SUNDAY AFTER EPHIPHANY

1 SAMUEL 3:1-10 [11-20]; PSALM 139:1-, 13-18; 1 CORINTHIANS 6:12-20; JOHN 1:43-51

All the baptized have a calling in God's world.God calls not just pastors and deacons but also the youngest child, like Samuel. The story of the calling of Nathanael plays with the idea of place.Nathanael initially dismisses Jesus because he comes from Nazareth. But where we come from isn't important; it's where—or rather whom—we come to. Jesus refers to Jacob, who had a vision in a place he called "the house of God, and ... the gate of heaven" (Gen. 28:17). Jesus says he himself is the place where Nathanael will meet God.

January 21, 2024

THIRD SUNDAY AFTER EPHIPHANY

JONAH 3:1-5, 10; PSALM 62:5-12; 1 CORINTHIANS 7:29-31; MARK 1:14-20

As we continue through the time after Epiphany, stores of the call to discipleship show us the implications of our baptismal calling to show Christ to the world. Jesus begins proclaiming the good news and calling people to repentance right after John the Baptist is arrested for preaching in a similar way. Knowing that John was later executed, we see at the very outset the cost of discipleship.Still, the two sets of brothers leave everything they have known and worked for all of their lives to follow Jesus and fish for people.

#### January 28, 2024

FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

DEUTERONOMY 18:15-20; PSALM 111; 1 CORINTHIANS 8:1-13; MARK 1:21-28

In Deuteronomy God promises to raise up a prophet like Moses, who will speak for God; in Psalm 111 God shows the people the power of God's works. For the church these are ways of pointing to the unique authority people sensed in Jesus' actions and words. We encounter that authority in God's word, around which we gather, the word that prevails any lesser spirit that would claim power over us, freeing us to follow Jesus.

## A COUNCIL UPDATE Plans for the New Year

Greetings members of First Lutheran,

As we enter 2024 there are big expectations on the road ahead of us.

We are getting ever so close to starting the construction project on the office remodel and HVAC installation. Once this project is complete, we pray our church facility will be in great shape for generations to come. The roof has been 100% replaced in the past 5 years, new carpet in the last 10, and with new HVAC for nearly 100% of the building, we'll have the major components of the facility upgraded. We realize that with any building, there will always be work to be done, but with these major areas addressed, we hope there won't be any large, unexpected expenditures any time soon.

Besides the building project, our council plans to focus on addressing a few key needs within our ministry efforts. We received excellent feedback from our survey last month. Based on that feedback, there seems to be a lot of support for seeking a gifted lay person to lead our youth group, rather than entering a call process seeking a 3rd pastor. So we're working on the process of establishing a job description and beginning that search soon. Other areas mentioned in the feedback were small group ministry and community engagement. We are adding those areas to the job description and hoping that the new staff person will be able to impact our ministry in those areas as well. We'll share more details on this process as soon as we can, but we're very grateful for all who provided their thoughtful responses to our questions.

It was a wonderful Christmas season with the FLY Brunch, Children's program, bell concert, and of course our Christmas Eve services. There's nothing quite like seeing candles fill the dimly lit sanctuary while singing Silent Night. Thanks to everyone who volunteered during the busy season. Your efforts matter!

Happy New Year to everyone involved with First Lutheran. We pray that God bring you blessings and show us all how to be a blessing to others.



## Adult Faith Formation Opportunities


