


ROYAL FAMILY KIDS

Here I share a few photos from Vacation Bible School in the church in Bogota where I am doing my internship. Featured are some of the games we played, the crafts we made, Christmas Eve worship, and the famous buñuelos, which is a special Christmas treat in Colombia.

I also wanted to share some highlights from 2023. The above photos are from La Guajira, Colombia. La Guajira is a region on the coast, the most northern part of Colombia and South America. The project I am accompanying has an educational program that operates in the city of Uribia. On the left is a photo of myself, the coordinator of the Justicia y Vida project, and two of the teachers from Uribia. In the middle, is a group photo after the closing celebration. The final photo on the right is a photo of the participants in the educational program. In this particular photo, they are in English class. Most of the people who participate are bilingual speaking Spanish and their native language of Wayuunaiki. So learning English would make them trilingual.

Below are three photos that are separate from each other. On the left is a photo taken at the theological school in Brasil while attending the Religion and Gender Conference. The middle is a photo taken during a gathering of the female leadership who reside in Bogota. In the photo are female pastors, female theological students, and the president of the National Women's Ministry. Finally, on the right is a group photo from the visit of the Alberta Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada.



WORSHIP THEMES

March 3, 2024 THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT

PSALM 19; 1 CORINTHIANS 1:18-25; JOHN 2:13-22

The third covenant in this year's Lenten readings is the central one of Israel's history; the gift of the law to those God freed from slavery. The commandments begin with the statement that because God alone has freed us from the powers that oppressed us, we are to let nothing else claim first place in our lives. When Jesus throws the merchants out of the temple, he is demanding the worship of God alone and rejecting the ways of commerce and profit-making can become our gods.The Ten Commandments are essential to our baptismal call: centered first in God's liberating love, we strive to live out justice and mercy in our communities and the world.

March 10, 2024 FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT

NUMBERS 21:4-9; PSALM 107:1-3, 17-22; EPHESIANS 2:1-10; JOHN 3:14-21 The fourth of the Old Testament promises providing a baptismal lens this Lent is the promise God makes to Moses: those who look on the bronze serpent will live. In today's gospel Jesus says he will be lifted up on the cross like the serpent, so that those who look to him in faith will live. When we receive the sign of the cross in baptism, that cross becomes the sign we can look to in faith for healing, for restored relationship to God, for hope when we are dying.

March 17, 2024 FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT

PSALM 51:1-12 or PSALM 119:9-16; HEBREWS 5:5-10; JOHN 12:20-33

God promises Jeremiah that a "new covenant" will be made in the future: a covenant that will allow the people to know God by heart. The church sees this promise fulfilled in Christ, who draws all people to himself when he is lifted up on the cross. Our baptismal covenant draws us to God's heart through Christ and draws God's love and truth into our hearts. We join in worship sharing in word, song, and meal, and leave strengthened to share God's love with all the world.

March 24, 2024 SUNDAY OF THE PASSION PALM SUNDAY

MARK 11:1-00; JOHN 12:12-16; ISAIAH 50:4-9a; PSALM 31:9-16; PHILIPPIANS 2:5-11; MARK 14:1-15:47 or MARK 15:1-39 [40-47] This week, the center of the church's year is one of striking contrasts: Jesus rides into Jerusalem surrounded by shouts of glory, only to be left alone to die on the cross, abandoned by even his closest friends. Mark's gospel presents Jesus in his complete human vulnerability: agitated, grieved, scared, forsaken. Though we lament Christ's suffering and all human suffering, we also expect God's salvation: in the wine and bread, Jesus promises that his death will mark a new covenant with all people. We enter this holy week thirsty for the completion of God's astonishing work.

March 31, 2024 RESURRECTION OF OUR LORD EASTER DAY

ACTS 10:34-43 or ISAIAH 25:6-9; PSALM 118:1-2, 14-24; 1 CORINTHIANS 15:1-11;MARK 16:1-8 or JOHN 20:1-18

Christ is risen! Jesus is alive, and God has swallowed up death forever. With Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, and Salome, we may feel astonished and confused, unsure of what to make of the empty tomb. But this is why we gather; to proclaim, witness, praise, and affirm the liberating reality of Christ's death and resurrection. In word and feast, we celebrate God's unending love, and depart to share this good news with all the world. Alleluia!

A COUNCIL UPDATE

Using All Our Resources for the Glory of God

Greetings members of First Lutheran. Here's an update from council on the latest happenings at First.

At our February meeting, we approved two Endowment requests to help startup a new GriefShare group and update security cameras at the SAFE Center. We're blessed to have a strong Endowment Fund that supports our ministry efforts both within our church walls and out in the community. If you have ideas for ways our Endowment Fund can be utilized, please connect with the church office.

We also approved several Ministry Team requests for Stevenson funding. For those who aren't aware, we received a large donation from the Dr. Stevenson estate back in 2015. One of the ways we're stretching those dollars to impact ministry into the future is by awarding up to \$15,000 each year to Ministry Teams seeking funds to support special projects or needs outside of their regular budget capabilities. Over the years, we've awarded funds for things like new technology and equipment, building needs, bell choir upgrades, and more. This year we awarded the full \$15,000.

One of the requests was related to community outreach and inviting people to worship with us. We're grateful to be able to honor Dr. Stevenson in this way!

Additionally, we reviewed a contract agreement with Wilkins ADP to manage our construction project for new offices and HVAC upgrades. We'll be making a few tweaks to the agreement and then signing to move forward with that project. For those who missed the Council Q&A related to this back in February, please know that the project is going out to bid in March and we will be starting construction this year! Regarding our capital campaign efforts to support this project, we can share that we have over \$1 Million in commitments with nearly \$600,000 actual dollars collected. Our cost projections are closer to \$1.7 Million, so there's still work to be done, but we feel we're in a strong position at the moment. Finally, we will be reviewing the upcoming fiscal year budget very soon. Our

Finally, we will be reviewing the upcoming fiscal year budget very soon. Our giving has been holding steady but our financial needs continue to be somewhat unpredictable as costs of doing business can fluctuate. We appreciate everyone being very generous with their resources as we put together a plan to support our ministry efforts now and into the future. Keep an eye out for more info related to the budget and a planned budget forum coming up in June.

From Endowment, to the Stevenson fund, to the capital campaign, and finally the general ministry and facility budget, we continue to utilize all of our resources for the glory of God. With an intentional focus, prayerful hearts, and faithful dedication to Christ, we believe we are moving along a path set for us by God. We thank you all for your support as we are "Growing in God's grace, reflecting Christ's love, and living in the Spirit."




