Habitat for Humanity®

We pause to recognize Stan Wilson, First Lutheran Church member and Habitat volunteer who died Monday, March 11. Stan served on the Family Selection Committee.

The 100th House Celebration Committee is forming. Bonnie and Ken Mumm, Margaret Messbarger and Patrick Waltemath have agreed to serve. Please contact them if you could join them or have ideas, memories or memorabilia to share.

April 6, weather permitting, the first onsite building for Habitat. Two foundations are ready for walls which were constructed in the warehouse.

Many volunteers mean lots of work accomplished. New homeowners will be onsite working most Saturdays. Come to meet them and hear their stories.

April 13, Several students from the UNK Construction Management program will work side by side with regular volunteers. The hope is to erect the walls House #99, while others put up trusses and sheathing on House #98.

April 20, UNK Big Event Day. Students will work from 9:00 to noon. There will be plenty of jobs for everyone as the trusses and sheathing go up on House #99.

April 27, Houses need to be wrapped before the siding goes on. More jobs open up each week with jobs for everyone skilled or just eager to contribute.



On Jan. 27, Ken & Bonnie Mumm and Kay & Rodger Payne traveled to Peru to help build two houses in the town of La Florida for the Fuller Center for Housing, an ecumenical Christian non-profit founded by Millard and Linda Fuller, who are also founders of Habitat for Humanity. FCH builds and repairs homes for low-income people in 17 countries.

MISSION OUTREACH OPPORTUNITIES



During the adult forum on Sunday, March 24, Shelby Riedman, a missionary from the Young Adults in Global Mission (YAGM), spoke about the program in detail.

The ELCA Young Adults in Global Mission program invites young adults aged 21-35 to embark on a transformative, year-long journey of international service. Through this program, ELCA young adults offer themselves in service and are shaped by the experiences of their global neighbors. The program offers six country programs worldwide, and Shelby had chosen Israel and the United Kingdom as her top picks.

Shelby recently returned to Nebraska after a year of serving her mission through Bethany Christian Trust in Edinburgh, Scotland.

The Bethany Christian Trust provides support to around 7,000 people each year with over 30 different services across Scotland. The organization is there to help people who are at risk of losing their homes, those in recovery, and those who are already out on the streets. Shelby expressed her gratitude for the support she received from First Lutheran and ELCA during her time in Edinburgh.

WORSHIP THEMES

April 7, 2024

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

ACTS 4:32-35; PSALM 133; 1 JOHN 1:1-2:2; JOHN 20:19-31

The Easter season is a week of weeks, seven Sundays when we play in the mystery of Christ's presence, mostly through the glorious Gospel of John. Today we gather with the disciples on the first Easter, and Jesus breathes the Spirit on us. With Thomas we ask for a sign, and Jesus offers us his wounded self in the broken bread. From frightened individuals we are transformed into a community of open doors, peace, and forgiveness, and material sharing such that no one among us in need.

April 14, 2024

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

ACTS 3:12-19; PSALM 4; 1 JOHN 3:1-7; LUKE 24:36b - 48

The gospel for the third Sunday of Easter is always one in which the risen Christ shares food with the disciples, meals that are the Easter template for the meal we share each Sunday. In today's gospel Jesus both shares the disciples' food and shows them the meaning of his suffering, death, and resurrection through the scriptures, the two main elements of our Sunday worship.

April 21, 2024

FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

ACTS 4:5-12; PSALM 23; 1 JOHN 3:16-24; JOHN 10:11-18

The image of the good shepherd shows us how the risen Christ brings us to life. It is the relationship between the shepherd and the sheep, one of mutual knowledge and love, that gives the shepherd authority. The shepherd's willingness to lay down his life for the sheep shows his love. First John illustrates what it means to lay down our lives for one another by the example of sharing our wealth with any sibling in need.

April 28, 2024

FIFTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

ACTS 8:26-40; PSALM 22:25-31; 1 JOHN 4:7-21; JOHN 15:1-8

This Sunday's image of how the risen Christ shares his life with us in the image of the vine. Christ the vine and we the branches are alive in each other, in the mystery of the mutual abiding described in the gospel and the first letter of John. Baptism makes us a part of Christ's living, and life-giving self makes us alive with Christ's life. As the vine brings food to the branches, Christ feeds us at his table. We are sent out to bear fruit for the life of the world.

From the Council

CONSTRUCTION UPDATE!

April 8, 2024 Greetings First Lutheran Congregants,

We hope this message finds you well after the festive Easter celebration. As we enter the Spring season, our building committee has some fun and exciting news to share with you regarding our office remodel and HVAC project. As a reminder, in November of 2022 the congregation voted to approve this project and enter a capital campaign process with a goal of raising more than \$2 million to support the estimated costs.

There has been so much activity happening behind the scenes in the nearly 18-months since that congregational vote. As of March 28th, First Lutheran received five bids from contractors interested in taking on this project. The bids ranged from \$1.6 million to \$2.1 million. The Building Committee has recommended awarding the contract to a local contractor with a bid of \$1,679,469. Nothing is finalized yet, but that is the direction we are leaning. Please keep in mind that with professional fees, furniture, and contingencies, the final price will likely be closer to \$2 million all-in.

As we work on a contract, our next step would be to secure financing such as a construction loan, and relocating our office staff to a temporary work location. The expected completion date for construction is Spring of 2025.

Once completed, we will have a beautiful new office space for our hardworking pastors and staff. We will also have significant upgrades to our HVAC system making sure we are worshipping and conducting ministry in a comfortable environment for decades to come. Our leadership team is delighted to know that our aging facility will have all new HVAC to go along with 100% replacement of the roof which was done just a couple of years ago. Addressing these significant needs isn't easy, but it is certainly worth it as it puts the building in a strong position for future generations.

Of course, with that being said, there are still challenges that lay ahead. Our capital campaign efforts have us on track to collect over \$1 million based on commitment cards received so far. That means we still need close to an additional \$1 million, enough to cover the remaining bid balance plus anticipated overages and associated costs. If you haven't filled out a commitment card yet, we ask that you prayerfully consider how your family can help support this effort as we continue to make space for faith to grow.

This message is meant to keep you all informed of what's happening with this project. This is a pivotal moment for First Lutheran Church. It's a big expense. Yet, it is so important to the future of our congregation and worshipping community. Think of all that goes on within our church facility. Think of the work that God calls us all to do. Think of the many hands that carry out this work. And think of the thousands of individuals who are impacted by that work. There is much to celebrate and for which to be thankful throughout this important process.




"Dinners For 8"
