

# WORSHIP THEMES

### JUNE 1, 2025 SEVENTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

ACTS 16:16-34; PSALM 97; REVELATION 22:12-14, 16-17, 20-21; JOHN 17:20-26

It is possible to hear in Jesus' high priestly prayer, a prayer he offered shortly before his death, the petitions of the ascended Christ for his own throughout history – to our day – and beyond. Jesus prays for us. In holy baptism we become believers in God, have our robes washed in the food of Christ's forgiveness, and receive the gift of life forever with all the saints.

### JUNE 8, 2025 DAY OF PENTECOST

ACTS 2:1-21; GENESIS 11:1-9; PSALM 104:24-34, 35b; ROMANS 8:14-17; JOHN 14:8-17 [25-27]

On Pentecost, we celebrate that we have been given an Advocate to accompany us. Poured out in wind and fire, water, wine, and bread, the Holy Spirit abides us in and among us. We give thanks that God speaks to each of us, no matter our origins, language, or life path. Filled with the Spirit of truth, we go out from worship to proclaim the saving power of Christ's love and the freedom of God's grace with all the world.

JUNE 15, 2025 THE HOLY TRINITY FIRST SUNDAY AFTER PENTECOST PROVERBS 8:1-4, 22-31; ROMANS 5:1-5, JOHN 16:12-15

"O LORD our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!" Today we celebrate the holy Trinity.

Paul writes that through Jesus we have peace with God, whose love pours into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, giving us lasting hope. We celebrate the gracious One-in-Three, eternal Three-in-One, as we worship in community; as we share water and word, bread and wine; and as we bring God's love and hope to our neighbors.

### JUNE 22, 2025 TIME AFTER PENTECOST

ISAIAH 65:1-9; PSALM 22:19-28; GALATIONS 3:23-29; LUKE 8:26-39; 1 KINGS 19:1-4 [5-7] 8-15a

This Sunday's texts paint startling pictures of the horrific nature of sin. The church's repeated celebration of holy communion counters that tragic reality in a continued showing forth of the death of Jesus until he comes again. It is a dramatic declaration of "how much God has done for you".

### JUNE 29, 2025 PETER AND PAUL, APOSTLES

ACTS 12:1-11; PSALM 87:1-3, 5-7; 2 TIMOTHY 4:6-8, 17-18; JOHN 21:15-19

Today we celebrate two great figures of the early church, Peter and Paul, who represent the spread of the gospel to both Jews and Gentiles and, according to tradition, were martyred on this date. The witness of Peter and Paul inspires us as we seek ways to faithfully proclaim the gospel in our contemporary context.
