

# A MESSAGE FROM KEITH POWELL, OUR SEMINARIAN - "YEAR TWO"





I want to thank you for your continued support and prayers while I have been attending seminary at Wartburg Theological Seminary in Dubuque, Iowa. I have been attending seminary classes as a collaborative learner. Meaning that I take classes full time online while also serving at a teaching congregation. I continue to serve and learn at Zion Lutheran Church in Albion, Nebraska.

It is hard to believe that I am officially halfway finished with seminary and getting ready to start my third year at Wartburg Theological Seminary. This first half of seminary seems to have flown by. Looking back on this past year, so much has happened. This past fall I was endorsed by the Nebraska Synod Candidacy Committee which allowed me to officially start my internship hours. I began my internship at Zion in June 2025 and will hopefully complete my internship in December 2026.

This past year I studied Hebrew Bible which is where we study the Old Testament. The first semester of Hebrew Bible is focused on the Pentateuch, the first five books of the bible, the second semester is the rest of the Old Testament. I also studied Lutheran Confessions, where we focused on The Book of Concord. I also took a leadership class and a class focusing on what it means to be a member of the Body of Christ. I also completed my preaching class which has helped me with preparing my sermons and helping me be more comfortable with public speaking.

This past year as part of my fieldwork, I also had the opportunity to volunteer at a local thrift store in Albion called Mission Possible Store. Mission Possible Store is a thrift store that is managed by the local Methodist Church but is completely ran by volunteers from the area churches. All the proceeds that are earned from the sales are given back to the churches to help with community programs. I have learned a lot this past year through my classes and serving alongside my collaborative learning site.

The greatest highlight from this past year was the opportunity to travel abroad with my classmates in January to follow the Apostle Paul through Greece and Türkey. We first visited the traditional baptismal place of Lydia. The story of Lydia's baptism is found in Acts 16: 9-15. Lydia was the first person to be baptized in Macedonia, modern day Europe.

# "YEAR TWO" FROM KEITH POWELL, CONT'D.

The next city we visited was the city of Philippi. Paul and Silas time in Philippi is found in Acts 16:16-40. The Letter of Paul to the Philippians were addressed to Christian converts in Philippi whom he had visited in his second and third missionary journeys. We also visited Thessaloniki, Paul's visit to Thessaloniki is read about in Acts 17:1-19 and the letters that Paul wrote are recorded in the bible as First and Second Thessalonians. We then visited the city of Athens; the Apostle Paul's time is recorded in Acts 17:16-33. The final city in Greece that we visited before heading to Türkiye was Corinth. The Apostle Paul's time in Corinth is written about in Acts 18:1-17. Paul spent some time in the city of Corinth. The letters that Paul wrote to the church in Corinth make up the books 1st and 2nd Corinthians.

In Türkiye we visited the Ephesus. Ephesus is an ancient coastal city located in present day Selcuk in Izmir Province, Türkiye. Ephesus was a recipient city of one of the Pauline epistles also known as the Letters of Paul and one of the seven churches of Asia addressed in the Book of Revelation. The letters that Paul wrote to Ephesus are found in the book of Ephesians. While in Izmir we had the opportunity to tour the ancient city of Ephesus along with the ruins of The Basilica of St. John, where John the Apostle was said to have been buried. We also visited the House of the Virgin Mary, a legend is that Mary, the mother of Jesus, may have spent the last years of her life in Ephesus. The Apostle's time in Ephesus is recorded in Acts 19. The final city we visited on our trip was Istanbul. In Istanbul Topkapi Palace Museum which contains alleged religious artifacts such as the staff of Moses, John the Baptist arm, and David's sword. We also visited the Blue Mosque, the Hagia Sophia, and the Hagia Irene. The Hagia Irene is where the First Council of Constantinople was held, which confirmed and refined the Nicene Creed. Of course we had to finish our trip off with a visit to the Grand Bazaar. The Grand Bazaar is one of the largest and oldest covered markets in the world, with 61 covered streets and over 4,000 shops. Being able to follow Paul's journey through Greece and Türkiye was a wonderful experience. I am incredibly grateful that I had the opportunity to attend the trip.

As Proverbs 3:5 says, "Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not rely on your own insight." As you never know where the Lord may lead you. Trusting in Lord has given me the opportunity to continue my journey in seminary, and I know it will get me all the way through to the end. As I began year three, I look forward to where God is leading me. I would like to thank the members of First Lutheran for their continued support and prayers as I move forward in seminary and towards roster ministry in the ELCA. There are truly no words I can say or write to show how much your continued support and prayers mean to me.

#### Kearney Area Habitat for Humanity Update

In **House 101**, painting is complete, the kitchen floor is in, and during the week of July 26, weekday volunteers began installing the beautiful cupboards donated by Meade Lumber Company. Outdoors, crews laid more sidewalks and started fencing.

Saturday brought even more progress—sidewalk forms were removed and stored for **House 103**, and volunteers leveled soil in preparation for future sod once the weather cools. Work also continued on fencing between homes and general yard cleanup.

Over in **House 102**, skilled painters brought Tyson & Haylee's home to life with fresh color. Next on the list: flooring, followed by cupboard installation.

As for House 103, we're eager to begin but are awaiting finalization of property details in our newest subdivision with the city. We now anticipate starting construction in early September.




# **Stephen Ministry**

# LUTHERAN WORLD RELIEF



In the early hours of July 4, heavy rains caused the Guadalupe River in central Texas to rise by 25 feet in minutes. As a result, catastrophic flash flooding swept through the Texas hill country, devastating everything in its path.

In these early days, your compassion is providing Lutheran World Relief Quilts and Kits as well as distributing emergency food, water, tarps, clean up kits, hygiene supplies and clothing to people whose homes were damaged or destroyed.

Thanks to your quick compassion, hundreds of families affected by the recent flooding in Texas had emergency supplies in their hands within 12 hours.



On September 14, our Sunday School students will help pack school bags and make personal care kits during the "God's Work. Our Hands." Sunday. This will help them know that even here in Kearney, Nebraska they can help people from other parts of the world and even here in the United States after a natural disaster.

What a great way to teach them to be the hands and feet of Christ and put their faith in action.

To be able to do this there is a wish list in the narthex. Please consider grabbing a tag off of the board and purchasing the items on your tag. You can place your items in the box under the board or in the cafe area.

We have a goal of sending 100 school kits, 50 personal care kits and 30 baby care kits. Even if we don't collect everything by September 14th, we will continue to take items until the packing day in November.

Here is an update from your Church Council

The Mission Trip to Asheville, North Carolina has had a very good response with 19 people committing to this relief effort. Pastors Rick and Michelle have booked the flights and have arranged for lodging and transportation while in Asheville. The Council has approved the use of memorial money from Mary Wright to help defray the costs of the Mission Trip. A post Mission Trip forum is being planned to present the trip results to the Congregation.

The Rental House Task Force met on July 31<sup>st</sup> to start identifying the issues and possible courses of action regarding this property. A great deal of progress was made and information is being gathered regarding this property.

# SEPTEMBER WORSHIP THEMES

#### SEPTEMBER 7, 2025 TIME AFTER PENTECOST

DEUTERONOMY 30:15-20; PSALM 1; PHILEMON 1-21; LUKE 14:25-33; JEREMIAH 18:1-11

Called to contemplate the cost of discipleship, we might be helped by translating Paul's request to Philemon into our prayer of the day: Refresh my heart in Christ. Strengthened by the company of forgiveness of Christ in holy communion and recalling God's grace in remembrance of baptism, we can be strengthened in this hour to "choose life"- to choose life in God as our own.

#### SEPTEMBER 14, 2025 TIME AFTER PENTECOST

EXODUS 32:7-14; PSALM 51:1-10; 1 TIMOTHY 1:12-17; LUKE 15:1-10, JEREMIAH 4:11-12, 22-28

The grumbling of the religious leaders in today's gospel is actually our holy hope: This Jesus welcomes sinners and eats with them. That our God seeks and saves the lost is not only a holy hope, it is our only hope. As the write of 1 Timothy reminds us, "The saying is sure and worthy of full acceptance, that Christ Jesus came into the world to save sinners." Thanks be to God.

#### SEPTEMBER 21, 2025 TIME AFTER PENTECOST

AMOS 8:4-7; PSALM 113; 1 TIMOTHY 2:1-7; LUKE 16:1-13; JEREMIAH 8:18 -9:1, PSALM 79:1-9

As we are invited today to consider what it means to be managers (rather than owners) of all that we have, it is crucial to recognize that we are bought with a price. "Christ Jesus himself human, ... gave himself a ransom for all." Apart from the generosity of God we have nothing –we are nothing. By God's gracious favor we have everything we need.

#### SEPTEMBER 28, 2025 TIME AFTER PENTECOST

AMOS 6:1a, 4-7; 1 TIMOTHY 6:6-19; LUKE 16:9-31; JEREMIAH 32:1-3a, 6-15; PSALM 91:1-6, 14-16

Consideration of and care for those in need (especially those "at our gate," visible to us, of whom we are aware) is an essential component of good stewardship. It is in the sharing of wealth that we avoid the snare of wealth. It is the one whom death could not hold – who comes to us risen from the dead – who can free us from the death grip of greed.


