Asheville, NC Mission Trip

Hello First Lutheran Family!

Our Mission Trip to Asheville, North Carolina was a truly special experience. After months of preparation, 17 of us flew over 1,500 miles (and one couple bravely drove!) to serve alongside local organizations and families impacted by Hurricane Helene.



Once there, we split into teams—sorting donations at the "I AM" shelter, painting and installing drywall, insulating and demoing decks, and even painting a shed that will bless a family searching for housing. Beyond the work, we listened to stories of resilience and witnessed the powerful efforts of community members still serving tirelessly since the storm.

The road to recovery is long—an estimated 15 years, much like Katrina—but we are grateful to have played a small part and to begin what we hope will be an ongoing relationship with this community. Along the way, our team bonded through meals, card games, and shared service, reminding us how much we can do together.

On October 19th, we'll host a forum to share our stories and dream about what the future holds for our church's outreach in North Carolina. Thank you for your prayers and support—we truly felt them with us every step of the way!

NEBRASKA SYNOD AT THE 2025 ELCA CHURCHWIDE ASSEMBLY: BUSINESS AND SPIRIT INTERTWINED



From July 28–August 2, twenty-one Nebraska Synod voting members joined more than 900 others in Phoenix, AZ, for the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly under the theme "For the Life of the World."

Together, they participated in the work of the church—electing leaders, considering social statements, debating memorials, and pausing often for prayer and worship.

Historic Elections and Assembly Actions

The Assembly elected new leaders for the wider church. The Rev. Yehiel Curry, Bishop of the Metropolitan Chicago Synod, was elected Presiding Bishop of the ELCA. The Rev. Lucille "CeCee" Mills was elected Secretary of the ELCA. Nebraska Synod rejoiced when PMA Matt Schur of Southwood Lutheran Church, Lincoln, was elected to a six-year term on the ELCA Church Council.

Significant actions of the Assembly included:

- Adoption of a new social statement, Faith and Civic Life: Seeking the Well-Being of All.
- Approval of editorial updates to Human Sexuality: Gift and Trust (2009), with a full reconsideration process set to begin this fall.
- Reception of the Commission for a Renewed Lutheran Church's final report, which shaped several constitutional amendments.
- Passage of memorials on issues including Palestinian rights, remembrance of Indian Boarding Schools, and accountability in addressing racism.
- Affirmation of a goal that youth and young adults make up 20% of churchwide councils, committees, and task forces.

Worship and prayer grounded every step of the work. Voting members paused to pray before votes and in the midst of debate. Highlights included preaching from Bishop Elizabeth Eaton, Bishop-elect Imad Mousa Dawood Haddad (Evangelical Lutheran Church in Jordan and the Holy Land), and Bishop Vashti Murphy McKenzie (National Council of Churches). A candlelight vigil for refugees and immigrants, and a powwow led by Indigenous Ministries and Tribal Relations staff, reminded participants of the church's broad call to justice and community.




































STEWARDSHIP





Called to Camp: One Confirmation Guide's Unforgettable Week

When Josh Sikes pulled into Carol Joy Holling Camp for the very first time, he wasn't quite sure what to expect.

"I've been around a lot of camps," he said with a smile. "...but I hadn't been here before. As soon as I saw the facilities, I thought, 'Wow. This is something special."

Josh, a longtime volunteer and now professional with Scouting America, is no stranger to the outdoors. With more than 20 years of experience guiding youth through formative, faith-filled adventures, he knows the power of a good mud hike and a well-timed Bible study. So, when his church needed someone to step in and bring a group of confirmands to camp, Josh was all in.

"I could've just stayed until the pastor arrived and then gone home," he said. "But I figured, why not stay the week? I wanted to be here."

Josh spent the week with a group of eighth graders—one of them being his own daughter—experiencing everything from high ropes to horseback rides, sno kones to pool time. But what stood out most wasn't just the programming. It was the transformation he witnessed in the campers.

"These kids... they grow fast. And this is such a small window to make an impact," Josh said. "They're so impressionable at this age. If we don't do it now, when will we?"

He noticed how Summer Ministry Team members engaged campers with energy and grace. He watched campers laugh, pray, reflect, and grow in their faith—all in just a few short days.

"I'm not convinced you need to be ordained to make an impact," he said. "In fact, sometimes a caring adult who's simply present can connect in ways others can't. You just have to show up and be real."

Josh even found himself the target of some classic middle school charm.

"The boys flattered me into setting the table with them one day," he said, laughing. "It wasn't about the task—it was about connection. That's what camp is all about."

Even when his unofficial role as church paparazzi drew a few groans... "Some of them were like, 'Please stop taking my picture!" ...he knew the memories were worth preserving.

"It's all going in the big slideshow for the congregation," he joked. "Well... maybe."

For Josh, the week at camp was more than a ministry opportunity—it was personal.

"I've had these kids in confirmation for years, and getting to walk alongside them this week, seeing their growth... it was powerful. My daughter even said, 'The week went too fast.' From a middle schooler? That says a lot."

And would he come back?

"In a heartbeat," he said. "I already told my wife we're coming back to visit."

Josh's story is a reminder that God calls all kinds of people to make a difference in young lives. Whether you're a rostered leader or a church volunteer—there's a place for you at camp.

You don't need to know all the answers. You just need to show up, listen well, and maybe say yes to setting the table.





Here is an update from your Church Council.

As I write this article, 19 people are preparing to depart on the mission trip to Asheville, North Carolina to aid in the disaster recovery efforts. On October 19th, we will be holding a forum between the services to report back to the congregation on what experiences we had and what projects we worked on while in Asheville.

The 3206 H Avenue Task Force met again on August 21st. At this meeting information regarding the costs of the various options were presented. The Task Force is still gathering additional cost estimates regarding this project and will meet again on September 25th to review our options with the goal of presenting three options to the Church Council in October for consideration on what our best course of action is for this property.

TIME AFTER PENTECOST

HABAKKUK 1:1-4; 2:1-4; PSALM 37:1-9; 2 TIMOTHY 1:1-14; LUKE 17:5-10
