



Call to Order: President Judy Workman – 6 in attendance

Purpose Statement read and Devotion: Judy shared the devotion “Chocolate Chip Cookie Love” reminder of what you love about coming home and the blessings of family.

Minutes – November 4, 2025 – Stacy Darveau read the Minutes. Addition – Donations at the Christmas Coffee went directly to the Safe Center. The event could not be used as a fundraiser for sponsors. Motion to approve the minutes as amended. (Jo/Sherryl). Motion Seconded Carried (MSC) to approve.

YOUTH MINISTRY - FLY





Greetings First Lutheran Congregation,

The 3206 Ave H property online auction has been completed. The Council accepted a bid of \$178,000 for this property.

An update regarding the Capital Campaign Pledges: of the \$1,029,114 pledges received, \$1,028,761 has been received, with \$353 remaining to be received. I would like to thank the Congregation for their ongoing support of this renovation project.

ELCA Good Gift: We received \$3,925 during this campaign. With the matching Endowment pledge of \$3,000, we are able to send a total of \$6,925 to the ELCA for hunger relief.

WORSHIP THEMES

FEBRUARY 1, 2026 FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

MICAH 6:1-8; PSALM 15; 1
CORINTHIANS 1:18-31; MATTHEW 5:1-12

Who are the blessed ones of God? For Micah, they are those who do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God. For Paul, they are the ones who find wisdom in the weakness of the cross. For Jesus, they are the poor, the meek, the merciful, the pure in heart, the peacemakers, those who mourn, and those who hunger for righteousness. In baptism, we find our blessed identify and calling in this countercultural way of living and serving.

FEBRUARY 8, 2026 FIFTH SUNDAY AFTER EPIPHANY

ISAIAH 58:1-9a [9b-12]; PSALM 112:1-9 [10]; 1 CORINTHIANS 2:1-12 [13-16]; MATTHEW 5:13-20

Light shines in the darkness for the upright, the psalmist sings. Isaiah declares that when we lose the bonds of injustice and share our bread with the hungry, the light breaks forth like dawn. In another passage from the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus, the light of the world, calls his followers to the light of their good words shine before others. Through baptism we are sent into the world to shine with the light of Christ.

FEBRUARY 15, 2026 TRANSFIGURATION OF OUR LORD LAST SUNDAY OF EPIPHANY

EXODUS 24:12-18; PSALM 2; PSALM 99; 2 PETER 1:16-21; MATTHEW 17:1-9

Today's festival is a bridge between the Advent-Christmas-Epiphany cycle that comes to a close today and the Lent-Easter cycle that begins in several days. On a high mountain Jesus is revealed as God's beloved Son, echoing the words at his baptism. The vision of glory sustains us as Jesus faces his impending death in Jerusalem. We turn this week to Ash Wednesday and our yearly baptismal journey from Lent to Easter. Some churches put aside the alleluia at the conclusion of today's liturgy. This word of joy will be omitted during the penitential season of Lent and will be sung again at Easter.

FEBRUARY 22, 2026 FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT

GENESIS 2:15-17; 3:1-7; PSALM 32; ROMANS 5:12-19; MATTHEW 4:1-11

Today's gospel tells of Jesus' temptation in the desert. His forty-day fast becomes the basis of our Lenten pilgrimage. In the early church Lent was a time of intense preparation for those to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. This catechetical focus on the meaning of faith is at the heart of our Lenten journey to the baptismal waters of Easter. Hungry for God's mercy, we receive the bread of life to nourish us for the days ahead.

A letter from First Lutheran's Insurance provider:

Greetings! I wanted to touch base as we've had several ministries report cyber attacks and phishing emails. Ministries and churches are often targeted due to the perceived inherent trust.

Be on the lookout for:

- *Phishing Attacks – we are seeing these go out to staff trying to trick you into releasing sensitive information (list of members with personal information included). It's critical to let people know to watch for these type of emails and not release information.*
- *Business Email Compromise – hackers infiltrate email accounts to impersonate leadership asking for funds, gift cards, etc. It's important to let your members know you would not ask for such items by email or text.*
- *Ransomware Attacks – this is malicious software that can encrypt files and then demand a ransom for release, disrupting services, giving platforms, etc.*

When in doubt, always contact the individual requesting information to be sure it is legitimate and don't click on malicious links (hover your mouse over the link to see the actual destination to see if you recognize it).

DATES TO REMEMBER
