What if the opposite of being bound is being whole? Our world is filled with things that hold us captive. These things that bind us prevent us from living the whole, abundant life that God has promised us. Through the stories of regular people encountering

Jesus, and being drawn to the wholeness that Jesus provides, we can learn about our own longings and be drawn into wholeness.

Holy Week is the most sacred time in the Christian calendar, marking Jesus' final days on earth and his ultimate sacrifice for humanity.

It is a time of deep spiritual reflection, reminding believers of his journey of love, suffering and redemption.

The week begins with Palm Sunday, celebrating Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem, followed by Maundy Thursday, commemorating the Last Supper where Jesus washed his disciples' feet and shared a final meal with them. Good Friday is a day of reflection, remembering his crucifixion – a sacrifice made to redeem the world. Holy Week leads to Easter Sunday, a day of hope, celebrating Christ's resurrection and victory over sin and death.

This final day of Holy Week is also known as the Great Sabbath, Easter Eve, Joyous Saturday and more. It marks a day of anticipation, meditation and reflection, and for some, preparations for Easter Sunday celebrations. It also marks the end of Lent (fasting) that many undertake in the leadup to Easter.

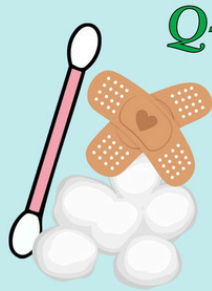

FROM THE COUNCIL

An update from your Church Council:

The 3206 Ave H property sale is set to close on or around March 3rd. It should be noted that at closing the only costs the Church will incur will be the usual pro-ration of real estate taxes, documentary stamps and similar costs. The Church will NOT be paying any commissions on this sale as the purchaser will be paying a buyer's fee.

We have had a very successful Capital Campaign for the renovation project. While most pledges have been received, there are still some pledges outstanding and it is anticipated that the majority of the outstanding pledges will be received. The Council would like to thank the Congregation for their ongoing support of this project.

The Council approved two Stevenson Grant requests, the first from FLY in the amount of \$1500 for basement updates/improvements in the youth area. The second request was from the Property Committee in the amount of \$2700 to update the Church's security system.

The Council also approved the summer worship schedule. Beginning May 24th and continuing through August 23rd, there will be **one Sunday** worship service at 9:45am. The Saturday evening service will not be affected and the service will remain at 6:00pm.

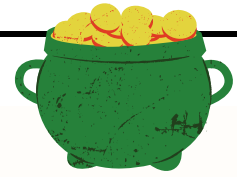

WORSHIP THEMES

MARCH 1, 2026
 SECOND SUNDAY IN LENT
 GENESIS 12:1-4a; PSALM 121; ROMANS 4:1-5, 13-17; JOHN 3:1-17

During Lent we journey with all those around the world who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil. In today's gospel Jesus tells Nicodemus that he must be born of water and Spirit. At the font, we are given a new birth as children of God. As God made a covenant with Abraham, in baptism, God promises to raise us up with Christ to new life. From worship we are sent forth to proclaim God's love for all the world.

MARCH 8, 2026
 THIRD SUNDAY IN LENT
 EXODUS 17:1-7; PSALM 95; ROMANS 5:1-11; JOHN 4:5-42

In today's gospel the Samaritan woman asks Jesus for water, an image of our thirst for God. Jesus offers living water, a sign of God's grace flowing from the waters of baptism. The early church used this gospel and those of the next two Sundays to deepen baptismal reflection during the final days of preparation before baptism at Easter. As we journey to the resurrection feast, Christ comes among us in word, bath, and meal – offering us the life-giving water of God's mercy and forgiveness.

MARCH 15, 2026
 FOURTH SUNDAY IN LENT
 1 SAMUEL 16:1-13; PSALM 23; EPHESIANS 5:8-15; JOHN 9:1-41

Baptism is sometimes called enlightenment. The gospel for this Sunday is the story of the man born blind healed by Christ. "I was blind, now I see," declares the man. In baptism God opens our eyes to see the truth of who we are: God's beloved children. As David was anointed king of Israel, in baptism God anoints our head with oil, and calls us to bear witness to the light of Christ in our daily lives.

MARCH 22, 2026
 FIFTH SUNDAY IN LENT
 EZEKIEL 37:1-14; PSALM 130; ROMANS 8:6-11; JOHN 11:1-45

In today's gospel Jesus reveals his power over death by raising Lazarus from the dead. The prophet Ezekiel prophesies God breathing new life into dry bones. To those in exile or living in the shadows of death, these stories proclaim God's promise of resurrection. In baptism we die with Christ that we might also be raised with him to new life. At the Easter Vigil we will welcome the newly baptized as we remember God's unfailing promise in our baptism.

MARCH 29, 2026
 SUNDAY OF THE PASSION
 PALM SUNDAY
 MATTHEW 21:1-11; ISAIAH 50:4-9a; PSALM 31:9-16; PHILIPPIANS 2:5-11; MATTHEW 26:14-27:66; MATTHEW 27:11-54

Today, we encounter the paradox that defines our faith: Jesus Christ is glorified king and humiliated servant. We too are full of paradox: like Peter, we fervently desire to follow Christ; but find ourselves afraid, denying God. We wave palms in celebration today as Christ comes into our midst and we follow with trepidation as his path leads to death on the cross. Amid it all we are invited into this paradoxical promise of life through Christ's broken body and outpoured love in a meal of bread and wine. We begin this week that stands at the center of the church year, anticipating the completion of God's astounding work.
