A LETTER FROM THE PASTOR

Dear First Lutheran,

It is an exciting time at First Lutheran as we prepare to welcome an intern. A few years ago, First Lutheran hosted an intern (Vicar Liz Radtke, 2005-2006) and now we are doing it again. Our intern will be starting her year with us on August 1st. Her name is Libby Florian, and she is a second career seminarian who lives with her husband in Hastings from where she will commute. I will let her introduce herself after she begins.

Internship is an important part of the formation for future ELCA Pastors and Deacons. Students learn not only how to do the tasks of ministry, but also how to embody the office of ministry to which they are being called. The purpose of internship as defined by Wartburg Theological Seminary where Libby is a student:

The purpose of internship is for students to develop their pastoral skills and pastoral imagination through an experience of practicing ministry and reflecting upon that experience. It is an action-reflection style of learning. Interns grow in their pastoral identity, spiritual development, theological reflection, practical skills, emotional maturity, stewardship leadership, and missional leadership.

Since Libby is a student learning to become a pastor, her title will be “Vicar”. By calling her “Vicar Libby”, we are clarifying that she is a student and not an ordained pastor. The vicar receives a monthly stipend, and there are some seminary fees as well. All of this has been covered by a First Lutheran Endowment grant, so there will be no impact to the church ministry budget. I will be her internship supervisor so there is a clear understanding of who will be working with her and doing her evaluations. Kyle Means has agreed to chair the “Internship Committee” which will be a group of members from our congregation who provide feedback and encouragement to Vicar Libby throughout her year here.

Now that we have ample, usable office space, we look forward to welcoming Vicar Libby to the office suite, and her office will be the prior Stephen Ministry Training room. Please help her feel welcome!

Hurricane Helene brought historic flooding to Asheville in 2024 causing more than \$53 billion in damage across North Carolina. Our First Lutheran Mission Team of 19 individuals coordinated with Lutheran Disaster Relief to aide in the recovery efforts at the one year anniversary in 2025.

We assisted in multiple locations with painting, decking, insulation work, drywall, and helped in donation centers. It was so rewarding to help the people of Asheville, but our work is not over. The items in the Personal Care kit provide much needed self-care, critical germ fighting, and the chance to regain dignity amid situations of fear and uncertainty.

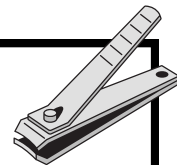
Items in the Personal Care kits are lightweight bath towels, toothbrush, sturdy comb and metal nail clippers.

We are most in need of bath towels and nail clippers. If you would like to donate money then we could use the money to purchase in bulk.

You could leave it in the office marked LWR.



PERSONAL CARE KITS



SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

- Be sure to shop for light- or medium-weight towels, which are easier for Kit recipients to hand wash and air dry, take up less storage space and are considerably less expensive than the fluffier towels we may prefer to use.
- Bath towels vary in size. The 52" X 27" size listed in the guidelines is the maximum size. 20" x 40" is a good guideline for a minimum size.
- Please give new items only.
- Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- All items should be new and in good condition.
- Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH PERSONAL CARE KIT

- ☐ **ONE** light-weight bath-size towel (between 20" x 40" and 52" x 27"), dark color recommended
- ☐ **TWO** or three bath-size bars of soap equaling 8 to 9 oz., any brand, in original wrapping
- ☐ **ONE** adult-size toothbrush in it's original packaging*
- ☐ **ONE** sturdy comb, remove packaging
- ☐ **ONE** metal nail clippers (attached file optional), remove packaging

* Toothbrush multi-packs may be used by sealing an individual toothbrush in a business-size envelope; no plastic bags or wrap

HOW TO PACK YOUR PERSONAL CARE KITS

- Fold the towel in half. Place the rest of the items in the towel, fold and roll so nothing falls out, and secure with yarn, ribbon, string or rubber bands.
- Pack completed Kits, like items together, in boxes. Label contents in LARGE, BLOCK LETTERS on the outside of the boxes.
- Use strong cartons secured with packing tape, not to exceed 40 pounds.
- Do not use plastic or paper bags to pack donations.
- Include the name and address of your group or congregation on each box and label the contents
